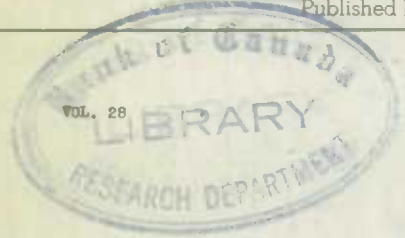

MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

NOVEMBER, 1950

A very active month in freight traffic was reported by Canadian railways for November when 13,797,334 tons of revenue freight were moved, a gain of 944,165 tons or 7.35 p.c. over the revised total (to include Newfoundland) of 12,853,169 tons in November of 1949 but below the peak for November in 1948 at 14,565,078 tons when wheat, grain, coal, pulpwood, newsprint and other items were heavier. The month under review is thus the second highest November recorded. Domestic freight loaded totalled 10,432,292 tons against 10,050,514 tons one year earlier, while receipts from foreign connections rose from 2,802,655 to 3,365,042 tons with both imports and intranait shipments up sharply.

Gains predominated over the previous November in total freight transported of Mine Products, Forest Products and Manufactures and Miscellaneous Commodities while Agricultural and Animals and Animal Products were lower. Ten of the 16 agricultural items registered decreases with wheat, corn, oats, rye, apples and potatoes down rather sharply. The total for the group at 2,923,449 tons was off 7.41 p.c. or 233,829 tons. Lighter movements of livestock, hogs and meats caused a decline of 23,867 tons in the Animals and Animal Products class with the total at 247,431 tons against 271,298 tons one year earlier when the export demand was keener. Most mine products were heavier and the total reached 5,345,760 tons or 525,429 tons above the group total in the preceding November. Bituminous coal improved 152,498 tons to 1,370,365 but anthracite slipped 119,640 tons to 402,620 tons. Iron ores and concentrates advanced 69,019 tons to 275,818 tons while other ores jumped 211,326 tons to 772,103 tons. Building products posted good gains over November, 1949 volume. Crude petroleum, due mainly to the western pipeline diversion, dropped from 159,729 to 82,097 tons. All forestry items except cordwood advanced and the total at 1,264,984 tons was up 180,299 tons or 16.6 p.c. Both pulpwood and lumber showed appreciable increases, pulpwood gaining 62,595 tons to 348,487 while lumber climbed 103,920 tons above the preceding November to 682,969 tons. The manufactures and miscellaneous commodities showed 16 commodities out of 25 advancing with the total for November at 4,015,710, up 496,133 tons above the same period of 1949. Sizeable declines were confined to sugar, rails, cement, implements, furniture, beverages and fish. Gasoline, petroleum oils and products, pig iron, iron and steel, castings and building products posted splendid gains. Automobiles and trucks reflected record output and rose from 158,947 to 199,803 tons. Fertilizers also gained. Newsprint totalled 282,776 tons against 271,943 one year earlier while other paper, paperboard and woodpulp were much heavier. Canned goods increased to 95,821 tons, up 6,864. Other manufactures and miscellaneous rose 195,860 tons to 1,242,539. L.C.L. freight eased from 303,543 to 295,603 tons.

A comparison of provincial loadings shows gains over November of 1949 in seven of the ten provinces. Newfoundland volume was up from 43,354 to 62,905 tons, Nova Scotia advanced 85,903 to 959,167 tons with mine products much heavier, New Brunswick reported 320,028 tons against 238,663 and Quebec loadings rose 162,315 tons to 1,652,760 tons with gains in all groups except animals and animal products. The province of Ontario had 3,345,570 tons compared with 3,171,623 tons for the preceding November, an increase of 5.5 p.c., although agricultural shipments were off considerably. Manitoba had the largest percentage advance of any province, gaining 282,866 tons to 903,392 as agricultural products rose from 311,815 to 566,531 tons. British Columbia shipments bolstered by mine and forest items increased from 858,501 to 904,858 tons. Prince Edward Island, due to the halving of potato loadings, declined from 49,212 to 28,237 tons. Saskatchewan with reduced grain loadings decreased 96,594 tons under the November 1949 total to 1,149,947 tons and Alberta dropped from 1,418,395 to 1,125,438 tons as wheat, coal and crude petroleum loadings declined sharply.

The total volume of freight carried by all lines during the first eleven months of 1950 reached 151,977,761 tons, an increase of 392,691 tons over the same period of 1949 but well under the similar total for 1948 of 142,386,911 tons to the end of November. About three-quarters of the revenue freight carried during November was unloaded at stations in Canada, with the balance to foreign connections.
