MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

JUNE, 1950

The volume of revenue freight carried by Canadian railways during the month of June this year at 12,521,819 tons registered an increase of 1,109,881 tons or 9.7 p.c. over the total, revised to include Newfoundland, of 11,411,938 tons transported in the same period last year and compares favourably with 12,565,218 tons for June of 1948, when the movement of pulpwood was much heavier and bolstered that month's volume. Traffic in all provinces was increased in June over last year except in Manitoba where the effects of the tragic floods were still in evidence in the early weeks of the month. Gains were shown in four of the five commodity groups with only animal products lighter this June.

The tomage loaded at Canadian stations rose to 9,558,243 tons from a revised 6,502,116 tons in the preceding June, an advance of 12.4 p.c. or 1,056,127 tons. Receipts from foreign connections for delivery in Canada eased from 1,722,157 to 1,520,911 tons as soft coel, ores, other mine products and steel imports were lower. Intransit traffic, however, rose from 1,187,665 to 1,342,665 tons, principally due to heavier shipments of lumber, automobiles and other manufactures across Canada between American points.

A review of loadings by provinces indicates increase in Newfoundland from 119,351 in June, 1949, to 131,616 tons,
Prince Edward Ieland up from 17,107 to 19,035 tons with animal products much heavier, Nova Scotia with shipments of coal and
other mine products booming, rose from a revised 799,673 to 973,267 tons or by 21.7 p.c.; New Brunswick volume rose 12.6 p.c.;
Quebec province reported 1,693,855 tons compared with 1,507,791 tons one year earlier as mine and forest activity advanced;
Ontario's mines and mnufactures pushed the provincial volume up from 3,150,605 to 3,476,431 tons; Manitobe recorded the wole
decline at 487,117 tons compared with 545,756 tons for June 1949 as loading of agriculture products receded sharply; Sasketchewan showed an encouraging gain of 139,506 tons to 620,277 tons with wheat loadings much heavier than during the previous June;
Alberta continued to display diversified growth with a total of 1,005,040 tons or 152,454 tons above June, 1949. Wheat, coal and
crude petroleum featured the advance. In the Facific province, all commodity groups registered improvement and the total tonnege
climbed to 832,109 tons compared with 744,632 tons one year earlier. Logs, lumber and woodpulp posted splendid gains over shipments in the preceding June.

The Canada total of agricultural products loaded increased from 1,320,589 tons to 1,429,585 tons as wheat rose from 643,877 to 887,414 tons and potatoes were up 10,444 tons over June, 1949 loadings to 34,171 tons. However, corn, oats, barley, rye, flaxmend and other grains were considerably lower. Apples rose from 563 to 1,223 tons. Among the animals and animal products classification, horses, bogs, dressed meats, eggs, hides and non-edible products advanced. Live stock dropped from 46,420 to 41,764 tons but the animal group total rose 2,352 tons over June, 1949 to 112,286 tons.

Mine products registered an excellent increase of 703,518 tons or 22.5 p.c. to 5,848,260 tons for the month under review. Bituminous coal rose from 668,165 to 773,764 tons, coke from 85,040 to 98,480 tons, and iron ores jumped from 219,858 to 440,432 tons. Sand and gravel shipments totalled 466,500 tons compared with 409,224 tons one year earlier. Crude petroleum was loaded to the tune of 176,158 tons against 122,456 in June 1949, 68,860 tons in 1948 and only 24,285 tons in the similar month of 1947. While the oil pipe line from Edmonton to Superior will likely affect this volume next year, iron ore shipment. from the Northern Quebec-Labredor development should later advance the mine products totals to record levels monthly. Salt and other mine products were also moved in much heavier quantities this June.

The forest products group led by a spectacular increase of 130,193 tons in lumber and timber shipments increased from 1,505,875 to 1,585,019 tons. Pulpwood eased from 549,657 to 528,865 tons and other forest products were reduced to 26,625 tons against 54,675 tons one year ago.

The manufactures and miscallaneous commodities displayed a variety of gains and decreases but the total was up from 2,620,776 to 2,785,093 tons or by 6.2 p.c. Gescline, petroleum cils and products, sugar, pig iron and castings improved while cement rose 6,430 tons to 176,151 tons as construction demand steadily increased. Automobiles and trucks totalled 56,950 tons of domestic loadings compared with 45,505 tons in June, 1949. Beverages continued to move in lighter volume but this likely reflects wider use of motor transport rather than any slakening of the national thirst. Remsprint paper at 287,654 tons compares with 246,256 tons in June of 1949 and 279,293 tons in 1948. Woodpulp advanced from 110,239 to 171,867 tons in the June to June comparison. Declines were shown in iron and steel off 7,760 tons to 113,502, lime and plaster, rails, sewer pipe, agricultural implements, other paper, fish, and L.C.L. freight at 242,862 tons against 259,774 tons one year earlier. Other manufactures and miscellaneous was appreciably higher, recording 713,830 tons losded, some 66,049 more than in June of 1949.

For the half year, 67,212,626 tons of revenue freight were carried by Canadian reilways compared with a revised 68,902,658 tons to the end of June last year and 73,113,651 tons in 1948. Unusual weather conditions, the U.S. coal strike, and Manitoba floods got 1950 traffic volume off to a bad start but recovery was noted after April. While the six month's total is 1,690,052 tons under 1949, considerable of the decline is represented by reduced imports which decreased some 751,000 tons. Domestic loadings were about 1,027,000 tons lower in the half year comparison with wheat, barley, other ores and concentrates and pulpwood down sharply.
