MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

JULY, 1950

Domestic and foreign freight carried by Canadian railways reporting for the month of July totalled 12,521,391 tons, the fourth highest total for the month on record and 1,350,463 tons or 12 p.c. above the 11,041,391 tons transported in July last year. Statistics for 1949 were revised to include Newfoundland. Freight loaded at Canadian stations aggregated 9,392,674 tons while 2,969,172 tons were received from foreign connections. Of the latter total, 1,851,885 tons were imports for domestic use and the balance, 1,317,289 tons, moved intransit between American points. In July of 1949 there were 8,322,882 tons loaded at Canadian stations, 1,539,894 tons from foreign connections for domestic delivery and 1,178,615 tons intransit. The gain in Canadian loadings was thus 1,069,792 tons or some 12.9 p.c. over July, 1949, with all provinces except Newfoundland registering encouraging increases.

Of the total freight carried during the month, Agricultural Products rose from 1,577,830 tons to 1,770,520 tons, the Animals and Animal Products group eased from 184,067 tons in July, 1949, to 181,980 tons, but Mine Products increased 352,109 tons to 4,862,125 tons. The Forest Products class was considerably improved at 1,669,536 tons against 1,323,994 tons one year earlier, while the Manufactures and Miscellaneous totalled 3,877,685 tons, up 12.5 p.c. over the 3,445,484 tons reported for the previous July.

Improvement in provincial loadings were shown over July, 1949, in Prince Edward Island where the volume of agricultural products was advanced considerably with the provincial total for all commodities up from 5,731 to 8,467 tons. Nova Scotia increased from a revised 825,969 to 857,893 tons with forest products featured. New Brunswick reported 288,291 tons against 240,494 tons one year earlier, with all groups higher. The total for Quebec climbed from 1,540,963 to 1,866,040 tons, up 21 p.c. with mine and forest products much heavier. The Ontario total improved 143,462 tons to 3,250,020 despite drops in agricultural and animal commodities. Gains in Manitoba were indicated in all groups except manufactures and the provincial total was 552,489 tons for July or 79,658 tons above the same month of 1949. The rise in Saskatchewan was spectacular due to the increase in wheat loadings from 170,939 to 410,565 tons, which moved the provincial total to 716,505 tons against 495,870 tons one year earlier. The Alberta aggregate at 895,348 tons rose 151,779 tons with a large gain in mine products. British Columbia bolstered by peak activity in mine and forest produced 828,307 tons against 726,547 one year previously, an increase of 14 p.c. The provinces of New Brunswick and Quebec reports have been adjusted to exclude the interchange traffic between the Temiscouata Railway and Canadian National Railways for the period, January 1st to July 31, 1950. Traffic moving locally on the Temiscouata Railway and interchange traffic between the Temiscouata Railway and the Canadian Pacific Railway for the same period is also included in July 1950 reports.

Among the total freight carried during July, major advances over the similar period of 1949 were shown in wheat at 810,036 tons, up 228,275 tons, corn up 5,759 tons, barley 27,507 tons heavier at 141,742 tons and potatoes increasing 10,742 tons to 29,538 tons. Horses, hogs, dressed meats, butter and wool and other animal products also improved in volume. The movement of coal was up sharply with both grades of bituminous some 111,000 tons heavier. Coke, anthracite, iron ores, base bullion, sand and gravel, and stone registered good gains. Crude petroleum transported grossed 186,698 tons, an increase of 44,376 tons over July, 1949. Other mine products rose by 113,413 tons to 620,653 for the month.

Gains were widespread in the Forest Products group. Logs and posts were up 14,386 tons to 124,397, cordwood advanced 5,933 tons, pulpwood from 578,907 to 631,747 tons and lumber, timber, etc., a splendid increase of 257,689 tons to 811,628 tons for the month under review. Plywood and other forest products likewise chalked up sizeable percentage advances. Increases predominated among the manufactures and miscellaneous group with gasoline, petroleum oils, sugar, iron and steel, building products, furniture, fertilizers and canned goods considerably higher. Automobiles and trucks showed 228,502 tons or 42,942 above July, 1949. Newsprint was up 6,267 tons to 287,767 and other paper 11,491 tons to 64,212 tons. Paperboard rose 8,951 tons to 58,302. Woodpulp totalled 173,764 tons or 63 p.c. above one year earlier. Other manufactures and miscellaneous increased from 947,501 to 1,157,887 tons.

For the first seven months 79,574,472 tons of revenue freight were transported by the reporting lines in Canada. This total is only 369,577 tons under the revised total for the similar period of 1949. The principal recessions in the current year to July and were in agricultural products, other ores and concentrates, pulpwood, pig iron, iron and steel, beverages, and L.C.L. merchandise.
