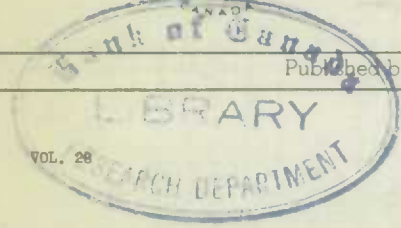

MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

AUGUST, 1950

Canadian railways carried a total of 10,274,024 tons of revenue freight during August compared with 12,361,846 tons in July and a revised total of 12,411,303 tons in August, 1949. The decrease of 2,137,279 tons or 17.2 p.c. was attributable mainly to the nine day strike of non-operating employees from August 22nd to the 30th inclusive. Average daily tonnage carried during the period actually operated in the current August was considerably better than for August last year. Traffic since the end of the strike has been encouraging and well above the similar weeks of last year. Totals shown for August, 1949, have now been revised to include Newfoundland data which was not then available. Freight loaded at Canadian points during the month under review grossed 7,418,211 tons against a revised 9,433,704 tons one year earlier while foreign receipts for domestic delivery eased to 1,423,846 tons from 1,649,526 tons but intransit freight totalled 1,431,967 tons, a gain over the 1,328,073 tons reported for August, 1949. American lines in Canada continued to operate during the strike and benefitted to some extent. For example, newsprint from the Ottawa area destined to the New York market was delivered by motor carrier to the New York Central at Russell, Ontario.

All provinces except Prince Edward Island reported reduced loadings as compared with the preceding August. Newfoundland was down 42,057 tons to 78,646 tons, Nova Scotia from 705,646 to 548,920 tons, Quebec dropped over 200,000 tons, Ontario some 649,000 tons to 2,687,605 tons while Manitoba shrank from 894,541 to 361,617 tons due to a huge decrease in the grain movement caused partially by a later harvest. The other western provinces were considerably lower with British Columbia down from 877,861 to 756,400 tons. All commodity groups registered declines from August, 1949, with the total of agricultural products carried by all lines down sharply from 2,268,721 to 1,392,200 tons, and animals and animal products weighed 165,799 against 196,850 tons one year earlier. Mine products at 4,140,449 tons were down nearly 898,000 while forest products declined only 61,829 tons to 1,327,853 tons. The manufactures and miscellaneous group showed 3,249,753 tons transported during the abbreviated work period compared with 5,717,691 tons for the previous August.

Despite the work stoppage some commodities managed to register increases over August 1949 volume. Corn, cotton, wool, butter and other non-edible animal products improved, while coke, iron ore and crude petroleum were higher among the mine products group. Lumber carried rose 129,585 tons to 728,853 tons. Pig iron and bloom was up 12,354 tons to 49,061 tons and automobiles, trucks and parts totalled 194,806 tons or 10,803 above August, 1949, with the gain all in intransit freight. Total woodpulp carried rose from 148,407 to 184,320 tons as Canadian loadings were 162,744 tons compared with 152,337 tons one year earlier. Nearly 459,000 fewer tons of wheat were transported this August while sizeable declines were shown in oats, barley, flour, fruit, live stock, coal, ores, building products and other mine products. Pulpwood was down sharply while most manufactured items posted large decreases. Considerable Canadian freight was diverted to motor carriers and vessels during the strike period but was confined largely to essential foodstuffs, supplies and materials. Some industries were forced to suspend operations briefly for lack of materials or storage space.

In the first eight months of the current year 89,848,496 tons of revenue freight were transported by all reporting lines, a decrease of 2,506,856 tons or 2.7 p.c. from the similar period of last year. Most of the decline is attributable to the strike. To the end of August, 1948, over 98,627,000 tons were carried with heavier movements in all main commodity groups.
