A near record volume of revenue freight was moved on Canadian railroads during February when a total of 11,205,550 tons were reported. Compared with the 9,806,650 tons carried in February of 1950, an increase of 1,398,880 tons or 14.5 p.c. is indicated. The peak for the month was reached in 1948 when 11,288,511 tons were handled. Canadian localings during the current February amounted to 8,280,197 tons while foreign connections furnished 2,925,555 tons, of which 1,517,510 tons were received from foreign connections. Domestic loadings were thus up 692,709 tons or over 9 p.c., while foreign receipts rose by nearly 32 p.c. or 706,171 tons. All provincial areas except Alberta registered increased traffic. Newfoundland volume was up from 55,551 to 48,511 tons, while Prince Edward Island increased by 12,465 tons to 41,243 tons. The gain in Nova Scotia was from 772,088 to 825,212 tons and in New Brunswick the total advanced 114,554 tons to 515,107 for the month. The betterment in the Atlantic Provinces was thus 192,925 tons or 15.6 p.c. over the preceding february. Quebec volume rose from 1,576,454 to 1,946,568 tons and Ontario lines posted an excellent gain of some 941,400 tons to total 5,245,795 tons. The Prairies were down 113,555 tons to 1,921,985 tons, the drop in Alberta offsetting advances in Manitoba and Saskatchewan. British Columbia traffic was up 107,962 tons to 765,289 tons.

Analysed by commodity groups, all five divisions increased with Manufactures and Forest Products leading the advance over the preceding February when weather conditions were less favourable and coal strikes in the United States had exerted a restrictive influence on imports and intransit traffic.

As a measure of the improved industrial activity in Canada this year, domestic loadings during february were also higher in all provinces except in Alberta where declines in coal and crude petroleum were sharp. Competition from natural gas and fuel oil is reducing Alberta coal output while the prefrie pipe lines have drawn the bulk of crude oil away from the railways. In Newfoundland pulpwood, lumber, newsprint, woodpulp and other manufactures and L.C.L. were much heavier this February while the gain in pulpwood was featured on Prince Edward Island at 12,557 tons against only 46 tons one year earlier. Coal shipments were lighter in Move Scotia but other mine products, lumber, iron and steel, fertilizers and most nanufactured items were up over February 1950 volume. Forestry items sparked the advance in New Enunswick and Quebec. In Ontario, wheat, flour, ores, building products, pulpwood, lumber, petroleum oils, pig iron, iron and steel, newsprint and woodpulp, miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. were considerably better this year. Agricultural products, butter, hides, pulpwood up from 51,079 to 62,848 tons, and iron and steel and other manufactures led the overall advance in Manitoba loadings from 518,882 to 588,077 tons. Wheat shipments were much heavier in Saskatchewan totalling 246,167 tons against 187,082 in February of 1950. Coal was reduced but pulpwood increased from 15,971 to 52,940 tons. Petroleum oils and products were up 5,239 tons to 12,510 tons. Alberta loadings of agricultural commodities showed minor decline. Livestock also was lighter. Sub-bituminous coal dropped from 515,496 to 218,654 tons and crude petroleum loaded was off 105,267 tons to 47,682 tons. Forest products produced the only worthwhile gain over the preceding february, up from 54,525 to 55,658 tons. In British Columbia apple loadings were down from 52,576 to 17,718 tons but livestock improved from 525 to 1,520 tons and other animal products from 2,989 to 5,865 tons. Coal and copper ores were lighter. The forestry industry contribu

In the first two months a total of 17,618,262 tons were loaded at all stations in Canada compared with 14,757,877 tons in the same period of 1950 and 16,588,549 tons in 1948. Similarly, total revenue freight carried by all lines, including domestic and foreign receipts, rose from 19,468,914 tons in the first two months of 1950 to 25,475,752 tons this year, a gain of 4,006,858 tons or 20.6 p.c. Improvement since the end of February has been most encouraging with the weekly carloadings currently at record levels.
