MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADAMAY, 1951

Revenue producing freight carried by Canadian railways during May totalled a record 15,874,417 tons for a gain of 1,261,696 tons or 10 p.c. over the same period last year. The current total compares with the previous peacetime high for the month of 12,855,816 tons registered in 1947 and the wartime maximum of 15,557,644 tons transported in the corresponding month of 1944. It is 36 p.c. above May, 1941. Movement in the western division during May of 1950 had been adversely affected by the Manitoba floods. Loadings at Canadian stations for May of this year grossed 10,758,450 against 9,605,529 tons one year earlier, an advance of 11.8 p.c., while intransit freight and imports from foreign connections contributed 5,115,967 tons or 126,775 tons more than in the preceding May. Imports showed only a minor gain as anthracite coal imported was considerably reduced from the previous May. Intransit volume rose 116,658 tons on the strength of heavier movements of animal products, ores, lumber and iron and steel, etc. Four of the five main groups posted gains over May, 1950, in total freight carried. Agricultural products amounted to 2,707,550 for an advance of 579,508 tons with wheat up 305,555 tons to 1,314,652. Oats, barley, flour, corn and rye showed sizeable increases. In the animals and products group an overall improvement of 28,570 tons was registered with the total at 205,205 tons. Sheep, dressed meats and poultry, other packing house products and dairy items offset declines in livestock, hogs and hides. Mine products posted the only decline, down from 4,950,023 to 4,528,053 tons or by 8.5 p.c., with most items lower. Coal was much lighter as were other ores and concentrates, base bullion, sand and gravel and crude petroleum; the last decreasing from 165,753 to 56,791 tons due to diversion to western pipelines. Coke, iron ore, stone and asphalt advanced. The forestry group had an encouraging increase of 697,890 tons or 62.6 p.c. over the previous May to 1,815,554 tons. Pulpwood carried rose spectacularly from 289,159 to 825,317 tons while logs, lumber and plywood also posted good gains. Lumber at 714,122 tons was up an impressive 111,547 tons over May, 1950 volume.

Seventeen of the twenty-five manufactures and miscellaneous items showed heavier shipments this May. The total at 4,620,057 tons was 377,698 tons or 9 p.c. better. Gasoline, sugar, pig iron, iron and steel products, castings and building products improved considerably. Newsprint at 548,050 tons was up 19,757 tons and other paper and paperboard gained. Woodpulp totalled 262,154 tons for an advance of 61,545 tons. The miscellaneous items grossed 1,817,878 tons compared with 1,205,510 tons one year earlier. A small increase was recorded in L.C.L. at 299,767 tons or 2,566 tons above May, 1950. Reductions occurred in petroleum oils, cement off from 241,973 to 207,420 tons, implements, fish, fertilizers, and canned goods.

Canadian loadings by provinces indicated sizeable advances over May, 1950, in seven of the ten areas. Newfoundland reported 147,107 tons billed during the month against 58,765 tons one year earlier for a gain of 88,342 tons with the movement of pulpwood greatly increased. Prince Edward Island with sharply reduced potato shipments, declined from 59,458 to 43,505 tons. A drop in coal and other mine products moved the Nova Scotia total down to 925,464 tons or 82,498 tons under the previous May. New Brunswick, sparked by a booming pulpwood output rose from 523,647 to 485,815 tons or by 45 p.c. The province of Quebec contributed 1,812,957 tons compared to 1,644,818 tons in May of 1950 as forest, mine and manufacture items moved in greater volume. Ontario showed an increase of 153,403 tons to 3,529,898 tons as mine, forest and factory output advanced. Agricultural and animal products were generally lower this May in the eastern division. Manitoba, recovering sharply from the previous year's flood, moved 770,817 tons against 456,697 tons with a large gain in agricultural products from 94,152 to 582,544 tons as wheat, oats, barley and other grains were featured. The Saskatchewan total of 997,945 tons was up 58 p.c. or 275,704 tons due to heavier grain shipments. Alberta lines suffered a sharp reduction in coal and in crude oil tonnage (diverted to pipeline), and the provincial total slipped to 974,739 tons from 1,057,824 tons loaded during the previous May, despite a heavier agricultural products movement. The coast province showed 964,702 tons for the current May, an increase of 70,100 tons or nearly 8 p.c., gains in forest products and manufactures offsetting drops in bituminous coal and ores.

To the end of May a total of 62,517,541 tons of revenue freight were carried on Canadian railroads for an increase of 7,826,554 tons or 14.5 p.c. over the first five months of 1950. The comparable totals in 1949 were 57,490,720 tons, in 1948, 60,550,453 tons and in 1947, 59,295,185 tons. The current cumulative was exceeded only in 1944 with 65,779,991 tons. Loadings at Canadian stations showed a gain of nearly 5,765,200 tons or 14 p.c. in the first five months this year versus the same period of 1950.

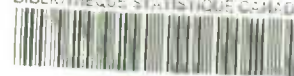
