#### MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

JUNE, 1951

For the third consecutive month Canadian railways reported that the volume of revenue freight carried had reached a new high for the period. During June a total of 15,935,405 tons were transported, compared with 12,521,819 tons in the same month last year and the previous peak for the period of 13,442,604 tons posted in 1945. The increase over June, 1950 was thus 1,411,586 tons or 12.7 p.c., despite a shorter work-week this year. Loadings at Canadian stations amounted to 10,902,495 tons against 9,558,245 tons one year earlier, up 14.1 p.c., while receipts from connections improved 67,336 tons to 5,030,912 tons. Intransit freight was lighter this June while Canadian imports (mainly fruit, fuels, ores, steel and other manufactures) advanced over 1950 by 185,520 tons to 1,804,451 tons.

In total revenue freight carried, agricultural products rose 922,065 tons over June, 1950, to reach 2,745,965 tons, with wheat up 561,802 tons at 1,462,564, and corn, oats, barley and rye much heavier. Other grains and potatoes showed declines. Shipments of animals and animal products showed a minor decrease of 654 tons to 179,279 tons. Livestock, hogs, cheese, wool and leather were down while dressed meats and poultry and other packing house products gained over the preceding June. Mine products, due in part to the operation of pipelines, dropped 148,202 tons to 4,921,444 for the month. Coal, copper ores, sand and gravel, crude petroleum and other mine products were considerably lower. Coke, iron ore, other ores and stone advanced. Forestry output continued active and the group total showed a gain of 545,770 tons or 34.3 p.c., climbing to 2,028,437 tons. Logs increased 51,075 tons to 182,820 while pulpwood doubled the previous June reaching 1,044,142 tons. Lumber and cordwood were down but the drop in the former was only 14,704 tons to 707,072 tons. Gains predominated in the manufactures group. Pig iron, iron and steel, brick, agricultural implements, fertilizers, paper, woodpulp and other manufactures and miscellaneous reflected increased activity. The principal recessions from the preceding June were shown in sugar, cement, autos and parts down 57,421 tons to 196,622 tons, canned goods and in L.C.L. merchandise which appeared sensitive to the new five-day work week introduced on June 1st. The decrease from June, 1950 in L.C.L. was 27,598 tons or 9.4 p.c. to 282,814 tons for the month under review.

An examination of Canadian loadings this June reveals that seven of the ten provinces had much improved volume. Newfoundland with mine products down, declined 14,215 tons to 117,403. Prince Edward Island, on the strength of a heavy pulpwood delivery, gained 12,708 tons to 51,745 tons. The Nova Scotia total at 952,532 tons eased from 975,267 tons in the previous June as coal, sand and gravel and other mine products moved in reduced volume. Iron and steel, fertilizers and miscellaneous manufactures, however, posted good gains. The New Brunswick aggregate advanced 125,627 tons or nearly 39 p.c., with a splendid recovery shown in forest products, which nearly doubled the previous June. The province of Quebec had significant gains in forest and manufactured products. The provincial total at 1,918,748 tons rose 13.3 p.c. In Ontario agricultural products and forest items were considerably higher while manufactures posted a minor advance. The total for the area at 3,719,557 was up 242,926 tons or 7 p.c. The loadings of agricultural products in Manitoba were triple the previous June and the provincial total climbed to 749,069 tons from 497,117 tons one year earlier. Wheat, oats and barley registered spectacular gains. In Saskatchewan agricultural products more than doubled the June, 1950 volume and pushed the provincial total to 1,122,041 tons against 620,277 tons, an increase of 79.3 p.c. Alberta had a much heavier loading of grains and manufactured items, but the diversion of crude oil to the pipeline network and smaller coal shipments caused a reduction of 61,910 tons in the provincial total to 945,130 tons. Coal was down over 52,000 tons while crude petroleum dropped from 169,456 to 52,271 tons despite greatly increased production, particularly in the Edmonton hinterland. British Columbia showed advances in all main groups except mine products. Forestry items gained 42,839 tons to 342,611 tons and the provincial aggregate increased nearly 9 p.c. or 75,458 tons over June, 1950, to 905,547 tons. Coal output improved but copper and other ores were lighter. Logs, lumber and plywood continued heavier, while fertilizers and woodpulp were much better this June.

A review of the first six months makes encouraging reading. Total revenue freight carried to the end of June reached 76,450,746 tons for an advance of 9,258,120 tons or 15.8 p.c. over the similar period last year. This is the best showing for any peacetime January to June in Canadian railway history and reflects the record current levels of economic activity and accelerated growth.

The wartime first six months of 1944 at 77,085,285 tons represents the all time high for the period.

Loadings at Canadian stations amounted to some 57,817,000 tons this year compared with 50,707,000 tons in the same months of 1950 for an increase of 7,109,000 tons or 14 p.c.

The weekly carloading record to September end indicates that revenue freight volume has been well maintained at better than 10 p.c. above last year, and with much of this year's huge western harvest still to appear as railway freight.
