





MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

JULY, 1951

Railway revenue freight transported during the month of July continued at record levels totalling 13,977,167 tons compared with 12,361,846 tons for July last year and 11,041,391 tons in the corresponding period of 1949. The indicated gains were 13 p.c. and 26.6 p.c. respectively, while the previous high for the month was registered in 1943 when 13,189,722 tons were reported. The last was slightly above the 1947 July total.

Loadings at Canadian points this July aggregated 10,678,229 tons against 9,392,674 tons one year earlier, a betterment of 1,285,555 tons or 13.7 p.c. Receipts from connections rose from 2,969,172 to 3,298,928 tons. Tonnage imported for domestic delivery was up from 1,651,883 to 1,902,527 tons while a minor gain was shown in intrastate freight at 1,396,411 tons against 1,317,289 tons in July, 1950.

Increases in total freight carried were reported in all main commodity groups except animals and animal products which eased 6,121 tons to 175,859 tons. Agricultural products, with large advances in wheat, oats and barley, totalled 2,612,299 tons or 841,779 tons above July of last year for a gain of 47.5 p.c. Mine products improved 103,302 tons to 4,965,427 tons or by 2.1 p.c. with iron ore, other ores, stones and miscellaneous mine products offsetting the sizable declines in bituminous coal and crude petroleum shipments. The forestry group reflected keen demand for pulpwood, rising 418,134 tons to 2,087,670 tons. Manufactures and miscellaneous products increased to 4,135,912 tons for a gain of 258,227 tons with 18 of the 25 commodities posting increases.

The pattern of Canadian loadings reflects heavy shipments of primary materials during July with eight of the ten provincial areas registering increases over July of 1950. Newfoundland volume was up slightly at 129,681 tons while Prince Edward Island rose from 8,467 to 23,329 on the strength of a large advance in pulpwood loaded. In Nova Scotia, coal and other mine products were down and the provincial total declined 36,176 tons to 821,717 tons. New Brunswick forestry shipments were nearly doubled this July with a consequent rise of some 117,600 tons in the provincial loadings to 405,890 tons. Quebec volume maintained the steady improvement shown this year with a total of 2,014,196 tons against 1,866,040 tons one year earlier. Forest and manufactured items led the advance. In Ontario, 3,892,788 tons were loaded for an increase of 642,768 tons with all groups except animals much higher this year. The Prairies posted widespread increases in agricultural products. For the province of Manitoba 659,327 tons of revenue freight were billed versus 552,489 tons in July of 1950, despite drops in animal & mine output. Saskatchewan, bolstered by heavy wheat and other grain movements, totalled 1,004,279 tons or 287,774 tons more for a rise of 40 p.c. The recession in Alberta volume of 39,369 tons to 855,979 tons was due mainly to the oil pipeline diversion and reduced coal production. In British Columbia, despite conditions of drought, a total of 871,043 tons were moved, an increase of 5.2 p.c. or 42,736 tons over the same month last year. Coal output was reduced but augmented deliveries of manufactures and forestry items offset this decline.

Analyzed by commodities, Canadian loadings show wide gains in wheat up two-thirds from 771,865 tons in July last year to 1,285,170 tons in the current July, corn up from 2,403 to 19,644 tons, oats advancing 144,159 tons to 304,455 and barley up from 134,852 to 230,762 tons. Flaxseed, fleur, and other mill products were also heavier. Apples and fruit improved considerably over last year. Cattle and calves dropped from 45,579 to 33,012 tons while hogs were little changed at 13,566 tons. Dressed meats gained but dairy products were considerably lighter. The tonnage of domestic loaded bituminous coal dropped 87,105 tons to 672,345 tons with sub-bituminous and coke also reduced. Iron ores and concentrates totalled 490,595 tons against 378,725 tons in July, 1950 and only 71,886 tons in July 10 years ago - a seven-fold growth in the decade. Sand and gravel at 450,486 tons eased from 481,903 tons in the previous July. Stone posted a good gain of over 80,000 tons to 381,824 tons. Crude petroleum due to the western pipelines was reduced by nearly two-thirds at 64,242 tons. Among forestry items, logs etc., rose from 116,392 to 147,903 tons and pulpwood was featured at 1,061,297 tons against 628,838 loaded in July of 1950, up 69 p.c. Lumber shipments dropped from 731,210 to 689,982 tons, with eastern deliveries lowered appreciably. Among manufactured products gasoline, petroleum oils, pig iron, and rails gained. Iron and steel products improved 14,858 tons to 126,361 with demand very heavy. Cement was lower by 13,000 tons to 137,204 but other building items advanced. Automobile shipments dropped from 55,164 to 47,680 tons. Beverages gained over 12,000 tons to 56,658. More attractive freight rates have been accorded on the movement of thirst quenchers in order to compete with highway transport. Newsprint paper at 289,138 tons was up 13,835 tons and other paper gained 9,174 tons to 35,156. Woodpulp at 194,086 tons was up 36,373 tons over the previous July. Fish shipments also improved. The miscellaneous manufactures totalled 785,611 tons for the month or 10.5 p.c. more. L.C.L. merchandise under pressure from the shortened work week dropped 17,908 tons to 205,970. This is the lowest July total for L.C.L. loadings since 1942.

In the first seven months Canadian railways carried an impressive 90,427,913 tons of revenue freight, an increase of 10,853,441 tons or 13.6 p.c. over the same period last year. The comparable months of 1949 show 79,944,049 tons (revised to include Newfoundland) and 85,703,204 tons in 1948. Since mid-September of the current year carloadings have been running under 1950.
