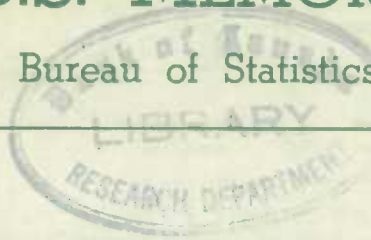

## MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

8504-507  
1-5-52

JANUARY, 1952

The traffic year started pronitiously with a new record for the month of January of 13,084,347 tons of revenue freight transported. This is a gain of 6.6 p.c. or 814,125 tons over the previous peak of 12,270,222 tons established in the same month last year and is nearly 40 p.c. above the volume handled in January of 1942. Canadian stations claimed 9,963,827 tons loaded this January compared with 9,338,065 tons one year earlier, a betterment of 625,762 tons or 6.7 p.c. while foreign connections supplied 3,120,520 tons versus 2,932,157 tons during the previous January. Import freight for Canadian points showed a minor increase at 1,637,428 tons and intranait freight moved up 164,349 tons to 1,483,092 tons with all five commodity groups higher in this classification.

A review of provincial loadings indicates heavier volume this January in six of the ten provinces. The Newfoundland total was up from 31,705 to 42,350 tons with bituminous coal much better shipments of pulpwood, lumber, gasoline and petroleum oils also improved considerably in the province. Sharply lower potato deliveries reduced the Prince Edward Island total from 45,346 tons last January to 27,778 tons. With a lower coal and other mine products movement, the Nova Scotia aggregate was down from 866,897 to 801,980 tons. The New Brunswick volume rose 68,345 tons to 473,047 as pulpwood shipments boomed. The province of Quebec reported 1,617,915 tons loaded against 1,537,844 tons one year earlier, a betterment of 5.2 p.c. as mine and forest products advanced along with a minor gain in manufactures. The total for Ontario was up 87,293 tons or 2.7 p.c. at 3,295,506 tons and reflected increases in agricultural products and forest items. Due to lower grain loadings, Manitoba was down from 480,420 to 432,233 tons but the forest and manufactures groups posted good gains. Saskatchewan on the strength of a greatly increased grain movement rose from 865,862 to 1,208,546 tons, a jump of 40 p.c. Mine and forest output was also better this January. Alberta likewise moved to higher ground with a larger grain delivery, the provincial total advancing 211,588 tons or 20 p.c. over January of 1951 to 1,274,538 tons. Coal mine and forest products were appreciably better this January in the foothills province. In British Columbia total loadings were reduced 44,132 tons at 789,934 for the month under review with the main declines occurring in coal and lumber.

Agricultural products, forest products and the manufactures and miscellaneous groups registered gains over the grand totals of all freight carried during the previous January. The total for agricultural items moved up 365,428 tons to 2,706,641 tons with wheat, barley, flaxseed, potatoes, vegetables and other agricultural products offsetting drops in corn, flour, other grains, hay & straw, cotton and apples. The Animal & Animal Products group continued to lower levels with a loss of 18,692 tons to 169,865 tons. Cattle and calves decreased 14,590 tons to 19,700 and meats, hides & leather and other animal products were substantially reduced this January. Hogs and other packing house products were heavier. The total movement of mine products was very slightly lower, the decline limited to 7,930 tons at 4,202,061. Anthracite and bituminous coals were lighter but gains in sub-bituminous, lignite and coke produced an overall advance in fuels. Increases were also shown in iron ore, sand and gravel and salt but copper and other ores, stone, crude petroleum, asphalt and other raw mine products were lower. A splendid advance of 366,663 tons in pulpwood shipments produced an increase of 313,287 tons in the forestry group, the total carried rising to 1,876,296 tons. Cordwood, lumber, plywood and other forest products were considerably lighter. Gains predominated in the manufactures group and the total showed a betterment of 162,032 tons, advancing from 3,967,452 to 4,129,484 tons or by 4.1 p.c. Iron and steel was much stronger, up 95,413 tons to 385,553 with demand brisk. Gasoline, petroleum, pig iron, castings, agricultural implements, autos, beverages and fertilizers also improved. Newspaper at 376,813 tons rose 18,717 and other paper, paperboard and woodpulp posted good gains over January of 1951. Fish and miscellaneous manufactures moved to higher ground with the latter up 53,745 tons to 1,104,300 tons. Building products were again lower as well as rails, canned goods and L.C.L. merchandise which dropped 77,141 tons to 206,655, a decline of 27.2 p.c. This is the lowest volume of L.C.L. freight carried in any January since 1941.
