APRIL, 1952

Canadian railways transported an overall total of 12,561,643 tons of revenue freight during April, a slight decline of 52,879 tons or 0.4 p.c. from the peak 12,614,522 tons carried in the preceding April but 16 p.c. above the tonnage reported in the same month of 1950. The Easter holidays contributed to the small decrease from 1951 when Easter had fallen in March. Further the drop was confined to receipts from foreign connections, particularly intransit freight; loadings of domestic products posted a gain increasing from 9,413,425 to 9,702,401 tons up nearly 289,000 tons or 3.1 p.c. and represents a new record for the month in Canadian billings, reflecting a high level of economic activity. Grain was again featured. There were 1,541,774 tons received from foreign connections during the month destined to Canadian points compared with 1,559,716 tons one year earlier while intransit freight dropped from 1,641,381 to 1,317,468 tons in the same comparison. Freight volume in the United States has been rather sharply lowered this year by strikes.

In total freight carried, advances were shown in agricultural products which increased 25.7 p.c. or 579,515 tons to 2,833,385 tons with wheat, oats and barley much heavier. All other groups were lower this April with the widest decline in animals and animal products dropping 59,386 tons to 124,786 tons as livestock and meats were greatly reduced. The mine products classification eased 139,864 tons to 3,852,034 with bituminous coal, iron ore and non-ferrous metals lower. Anthracite coal posted a good gain. The total movement of forestry products registered an 8.1 p.c. decrease, off 132,842 tons to 1,506,617. Pulpwood and lumber reductions offset an improvement in logs. Declines prevailed among manufactured items, the total dropping 300,302 tons or 7 p.c. to 4,244,821. Pig iron, building products, automobiles, miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. shipments were considerably pared. Gasoline and petroleum oils posted encouraging gains.

Turning to domestic loadings, we find the volume of agricultural products up strongly from 1,789,532 to 2,421,496 tons or by 35.3 p.c. Wheat increased from 931,872 tons in April, 1951 to 1,451,417 tons. Corn, oats, barley, rye and other agricultural products were considerably higher. Animals and animal products showed a drop of 16,676 tons from the previous April easing to 87,968 tons as livestock deliveries were nearly halved at 17,749 tons. Hogs were heavier at 25,292 tons against 17,945 and cheese shipments rose from 1,094 to 1,613 tons. Hides and leather were off from 5,128 to 2,899 tons. Among mine products declines predominated and national loadings were 190,531 tons lighter this April at 2,745,142. Shipments of domestic bituminous were slightly higher at 750,403 tons and sand and gravel, stone and slate improved. Other mine products dropped from 474,512 to 377,833 tons for the major decrease in the group. The forest items revealed a good increase in logs, posts, etc. which advanced from 148,567 to 223,959 tons and in ties but pulpwood shipments declined from 687,815 to 581,372 tons and lumber, due in part to lower eastern cuts and export problems, was off 60,290 tons to 530,238. Home building is less active. Manufactured items loaded at Canadian plants showed a variety of gains and declines. Gasoline moved up from 230,902 to 290,557 tons and petroleum oils improved 27,080 tons to 227,023 taking some of the sting out of the loss of crude petroleum transport to the pipelines. Iron and steel deliveries increased from 139,845 to 164,338 tons as domestic demand continued very firm. Cement, agricultural implements, automobiles, beverages, fertilizers, newsprint, and fish also were moved in greater volume this April. Other manufactures and L.C.L. freight continued to lower levels. The total for the manufactures group at 3,049,463 tons was only 34,208 tons under the record established for the month during the previous April. Provincial loadings during April were better this year in Newfoundland where gains in mining and manufactures offset a drop in forest items, the provincial total standing at 87,619 tons against 65,698 tons one year earlier. The Ontario total at 3,241,421 tons was slightly above the 3,182,981 tons reported one year earlier with agricultural products rising from 527,330 to 634,907 tons and forest items up some 15,000 tons to 370,890 tons while the other groups were showing minor declines in the central province. Saskatchewan loadings were spectacularly higher at 1,134,548 tons against 698,597 tons in the previous April, a jump of nearly two-thirds or 62.4 p.c. Agricultural volume was almost double at 953,613 tons versus 449,675. Alberta produced 971,035 tons of revenue freight during April for an increase of 13.3 p.c. or 114,173 tons. Grains, forest products, and manufactures were much better this April. In British Columbia total loadings gained nearly 100,000 tons as business continues strong, the total moving up from 895,286 to 995,249 tons with forestry and manufactures contributing the increase. Logs rose from 80,083 to 132,944 tons and lumber was up 30,710 tons to 273,668 tons. Decreases prevailed in the Maritimes and Quebec. The Prince Edward Island total dropped to 37,534 tons from 46,238 due to lower pulpwood deliveries. Reduced mine products brought the Nova Scotia volume down 56,404 tons to 831,551 and a wide drop in forestry output in New Brunswick pared the provincial total 79,617 tons under April, 1951 to 300,954 tons. In Quebec lighter loadings in four of the five groups produced a decrease of 158,119 tons or 9.6 p.c. to 1,647,004 tons.

The cumulative total for all freight carried - domestic and foreign receipts - during the first four months of the current year was an all time record of 51,046,896 tons, a gain of 2,403,972 tons or 5 p.c. over the previous peacetime peak of 48,542,924 tons established in April, 1951. The previous high for the period was established in 1944 when 50,222,347 tons were transported under the pressure of war conditions. Agricultural products show a gain of 2,207,528 tons over the first four months of 1951, up 27 p.c. while forest production gained 663,591 tons or 9.6 p.c. to 7,656,972 tons on the strength of huge pulpwood shipments.

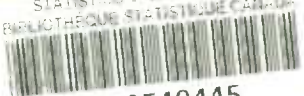
