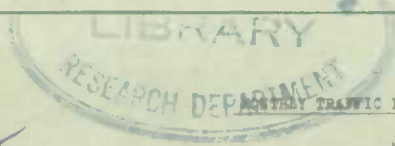

Canadian railways reported revenue freight tonnage carried during June at 13,472,834 tons. While this is a decrease of 3.3 p.c. or 430,371 tons from the record established for the month in the preceding June, it was well above average and 951,015 tons or 7.6 p.c. ahead of June, 1950. Loading at Canadian stations amounted to 10,614,826 tons against 10,902,493 tons one year earlier off 2.6 p.c. while receipts from foreign connections supplied 2,858,008 tons down 172,904 tons from June of 1951. The steel and iron ore strikes in the United States affected both receipts for domestic consumption and intransit freight, particularly of manufactured iron and steel items. Total domestic receipts declined 66,084 tons and intransit volume 106,820.

By commodity groups, total agriculture products carried during June were up 465,019 tons over the corresponding month of 1951 as wheat, oats, barley, other grains and flour posted good gains. Barley shipments rose from 257,476 tons to 383,669. The Animals and Animal Products group dropped 49,647 tons to 129,632 with all items except sheep and hogs lower. Dressed meats and livestock were much reduced from the previous June. The total for mine products at 4,693,333 tons was off 228,111 tons with bituminous and other coals, coke, iron ore, crude petroleum and other mine products posting wide declines. Other ores, sand and gravel and stone were better this June. Pulpwood loadings decreased by 391,623 tons to 652,519 and lumber dropped 88,681 tons to 618,391 forcing the forest products total down from 2,028,437 to 1,582,785 tons. Reductions predominated from the record level of the preceding June in manufactured and miscellaneous commodities with the group total off 202,180 tons or 5 p.c. to 3,858,100 tons. Some manufactured iron and steel items, cement, fertilizers, autos, paperboard, and miscellaneous manufactures were lower but gasoline and petroleum products, pig iron, castings, agricultural implements, beverages newspaper and canned goods were higher this June.

Cumulative traffic for the first half of this year amounted to a peak 78,322,044 tons, representing a gain of 1,871,298 tons or 2.4 p.c. over the corresponding period last year and is the heaviest volume for any January through June. It exceeds the wartime previous all time record of 77,083,285 tons attained in the first half of 1944 by 1.6 p.c.

Reviewed by provinces, domestic loadings posted advances over the previous June in Newfoundland, Saskatchewan and Alberta. The Newfoundland total moved up from 117,403 to 158,964 tons on the strength of heavier movements of coal, ores, sand and gravel, pulpwood and beverages. The Prince Edward Island aggregate dropped from 31,743 to 17,007 tons with potatoes, livestock, and pulpwood sharply lower. In Nova Scotia declines in apples, livestock, coal and other mine products, pulpwood and lumber generated a decrease of 119,805 tons from the same month of 1951 and the current June total was 832,527 tons. Similarly in New Brunswick reduced potato loadings, and wide recessions in pulpwood and lumber moved the provincial volume down from 443,123 to 321,066 tons off 27.5 p.c. The total for the province of Quebec stood at 1,697,995 tons compared with 1,918,748 tons one year earlier. Agricultural products and the mine products groups were higher this June but the large decline in pulpwood and forest products accounted for the decrease of some 221,000 tons in the regional total. The Ontario total likewise reflected an excellent harvest with agricultural items such heavier but declines in the other groups moved the provincial aggregate down from 3,719,357 to 3,632,726 tons or by 2.3 p.c. For Manitoba a total of 701,536 tons were loaded indicating a decrease of 47,533 tons from the high level attained in the previous June. Agricultural items and lowered pulpwood and lumber shipments accounted for the decline. Betterment was indicated in deliveries of animals and animal products, mine products and manufactures. A heavier grain movement pushed the Saskatchewan total 167,312 tons higher this June at 1,289,353 tons with a bumper harvest in sight. Barley was featured. The U.S. steel strike had one beneficial effect in that it made available extra cargo space to clear the Head of the Lakes of grain and speed up deliveries off western farms during the month. Alberta grain, notably oats and barley, was also moved in larger volume and total provincial loadings rose from 943,130 to 1,103,742 tons. Animals and animal products were also heavier this June as embargoes eased. Widespread prosperity in the foothills province has served to keep all commodity groups in a firm position. The British Columbia lines reported 45,637 tons less loaded in the month under review with a total of 859,910 tons. Reductions in mine products accounted for most of the drop as bituminous deliveries sagged over 60,000 tons. Lumber improved along with logs. Fertilizers and woodpulp declined considerably.
