MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA
AUGUST, 1952

While the volume of all revenue freight moved by rail during August continued at a fairly high level, the current total of 13,445,523 tons shows a decrease of 6.3 p.c. or 909,399 tons from the all time record established in August of 1951. The substantial increase of 520,223 tons in agricultural products was offset by declines in the other four groups. Loadings at Canadian points amounted to 10,462,862 tons off 4.1 p.c. compared with 10,912,615 tons in the preceding August, while receipts from foreign connections showed a much wider percentage decline dropping to 2,982,661 tons from 3,442,307 of this latter group, receipts for Canadian delivery were down from 2,012,702 to 1,796,735 tons and intrastate freight shrank 243,679 tons to 1,185,926 tons or by 17 p.c. Carloadings have been much better maintained in Canada this year than in the United States.

The cumulative total of all freight carried to the end of August was 105,795,936 tons representing a betterment of 1,013,101 tons over 1951 and largely attributable to the heavier movements of wheat, oats and barley, sand and gravel, logs, gasoline and petroleum products. This is the largest volume for any similar period in railway history.

Comparisons with August, 1951 indicate a gain of 520,223 tons in agricultural products. Wheat increased 247,865 tons to 1,840,053 under pressure of a bumper harvest in sight. Oats rose to 400,763 tons, up 89,914 tons and barley jumped 173,395 tons to 477,524. Rye, flaxseed, flour and other mill products were considerably increased. Corn, hay and straw, other fresh vegetables and other agricultural products moved in smaller quantity. The animal and animal products classification was again under 1951 as the embargo on exports helped to contract volume. Only hogs, hides and leather and non-edible items resisted the trend with hog shipments up 3,895 tons to 16,327 tons. Declines prevailed in the mine products group and the total was pared 519,774 tons to 4,698,784 or by 10 p.c. Bituminous coal loadings dropped nearly 185,000 tons to 840,112. Miscellaneous ores decreased 198,052 tons to 746,848 tons, and crude petroleum with pipelines expansion continuing, was again reduced from 85,918 to 47,081 tons. Mine items to register improvement in August included anthracite coal, iron ore, sand and gravel, stone and asphalt.

The continued sharp reduction in pulpwood deliveries moved the forest products total down from 1,901,802 to 1,502,042 tons. This loss of 400,000 tons was occasioned by a drop of 88,131 tons in lumber and 299,386 tons in pulpwood which slipped from a record 971,562 to 672,176 tons. Ties and other forest products were heavier.

The manufactures and miscellaneous group reported a decrease of 463,907 tons with most commodities under the previous August. Gasoline, rails, sugar and beverages alone showed betterment. The major declines occurred in pig iron, iron and steel, machinery, lime and plaster, agricultural equipment, automobiles down 47,166 tons to 125,733 tons, fertilizers, newsprint at 289,650 tons against 319,046 tons one year earlier, other paper, wood pulp, and in other manufactures and total L.C.L. freight off from 266,425 to 231,307 tons.

Turning to domestic loadings which were down 4.2 p.c., the picture is somewhat brighter. An advance of 584,033 tons was shown in agricultural products while the decline in the animal group was minor from 97,978 to 92,246 tons. However, sizeable decreases were evident in mine products off from 3,611,442 to 3,297,338 tons, in forest products 412,705 tons lighter at 1,373,097 tons and in the manufactured class which dropped 301,245 tons to 2,638,503 tons.

A scanning of provincial loadings reveals Newfoundland volume up from 126,114 tons in August, 1951 to 184,748 tons with mine and forest output much higher. Sharply lower pulpwood requirements cut the Prince Edward Island loadings to 7,195 tons from 16,939 tons a year earlier. Agricultural items were much better, up from 941 to 2,225 tons. Reduction in coal and other mine products pared the Nova Scotia total to 576,364 tons from 692,392 tons. In New Brunswick domestic loadings amounted to 315,560 tons for a decrease of 115,210 tons centered around forest and manufactured products. The province of Quebec produced 1,633,877 tons of revenue freight which was some 400,000 tons or 20 p.c. below August of 1951. Mine, forest and manufactured groups were lower. In Ontario the decrease was confined to 212,674 tons or 5.4 p.c. with the total off from 3,344,478 to 3,731,804 tons. Here only minor decline was shown in mine output but lower forest production and manufactures caused a decrease in the provincial aggregate.

Moving to the Prairies, increased loadings of grain boosted the provincial totals significantly. Manitoba at 825,476 tons was up 240,724 tons. Mine output was also better and manufactures nearly maintained. In Saskatchewan a total of 1,346,415 tons were billed, up from 1,192,427 tons in August, 1951 or by 13 p.c. Manufactures posted a good gain in addition to grain. Alberta recorded 1,074,466 tons loaded compared with 997,002 tons in the previous August. A gain of nearly 200,000 tons in grains offset other reductions. Both mine and forest output were lower in British Columbia and the August total of 766,957 tons was down 126,217 tons or over 14 p.c. Labour trouble in part reduced forest product loadings to 248,197 from 319,841 tons. Total terminations of all revenue freight during the month show 73.2 p.c. as unloaded at stations in Canada against 71.4 p.c. a year earlier.
