MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

JANUARY, 1953

The tonnage of revenue freight carried by railways in Canada during January totalled 12,132,001 tons off 952,346 tons or 7.3 p.c. from the record for the month posted in the preceding January, and compares with 12,370,222 tons moved in the same period of 1951. The month of December, 1952 had witnessed a peak movement in anticipation of January rate increases and volume in the month under review was thus depreciated to some extent. Domestic freight loadings amounted to 9,253,880 tons against 9,963,827 one year earlier, imports for local consumption were off from 1,637,428 to 1,517,974 tons while intranait freight weighed 1,360,147 tons against 1,483,092 tons in January of 1952 in line with reduced carloading activity in the United States.

The combined volume handled during the month shows reductions in all commodity groups except Agricultural Products where the total was up 126,095 tons to 2,832,736 tons on the strength of heavier wheat, barley and rye shipments. Wheat grossed 1,433,115 tons against 1,269,307 tons in the preceding January and barley rose 51,114 tons to 335,667 while rye jumped 21,422 tons to 37,275. Sizeable declines were experienced in corn, flour, other mill products, apples, potatoes and vegetables. The Animals and Products group dropped 50,525 tons under 1952 to 119,340 tons with only livestock, sheep and wool resisting the decline. Livestock freed from embargoes advanced 5,015 tons to 24,715 while wool was up 1,423 tons to 3,794. Heavy decreases were indicated in hogs, meats, and other packing house and animal products. Mine items were reduced 375,664 tons to 3,826,397 tons. Copper ores, iron ore, bullion, stone, crude petroleum, sand and gravel and asphalt were better but wide decreases in coal, coke and other ores and mine products offset the above betterment. Anthracite coal was down 120,937 tons to 195,998, bituminous 155,994 tons lower at 1,213,207, sub-bituminous dropped 79,190 tons, lignite 24,300 tons and coke 17,943 tons to 177,815 tons. Mild weather tended to slow imports, as well as domestic consumption. The importance of coal is declining in Canada in the face of expanding petroleum, hydro and natural gas facilities. A huge drop in pulpwood loadings shrank the Forest Products total from 1,876,396 to 1,394,458 tons or by 481,938. Improvement was shown in logs, ties, lumber and plywood but the pulpwood aggregate at 662,717 tons was down 514,971 tons. This sharp decrease is a little puzzling with newsprint output continuing at high levels but apparently inventory was being built up early in 1952 and more pulpwood is now coming to the mills by truck and water. Losses predominated in the Manufactures and Miscellaneous Classification. However, gasoline improved 20,224 tons over the previous January to 265,976 and petroleum oils were up 11,377 tons to 427,499. New pipelines may divert some of this tonnage in 1953. Cement was 27,650 tons better at 122,479 as vast power developments demand huge quantities in Ontario and British Columbia. Automobiles continued active with 220,579 tons, up 29,528 over January of 1952 but the increase was on intranait and import freight. Other manufactures moved up from 1,104,300 to 1,113,921 tons. Relatively heavy declines were indicated in pig iron, iron and steel, fertilisers, other paper, woodpulp, fish and L.C.L. merchandise. Newsprint at 366,362 tons was down 10,451 tons while iron and steel slipped from 385,553 to 314,181 tons.

Provincial loadings show fair sized decreases in five of the ten provinces, two provinces were slightly lower while three regions posted gains over the previous January. Newfoundland volume was down from 42,350 to 36,386 tons due to drops in pulpwood, lumber and in deliveries of newsprint by rail which have fallen sharply since April last year. The Prince Edward aggregate advanced to 28,770 tons from 27,778 with potatoes moving in a hurry up from 17,448 to 22,734 tons. Pulpwood loadings dropped sadly from 4,085 to nil tons. For Nova Scotia, the regional total was 801,881 tons in January against 801,980 tons a year earlier. Gains in manufactures nearly offset declines in forest and other groups. The New Brunswick loadings were down 135,870 tons to 337,177 as forestry items were halved at 137,404 tons. Pulpwood alone was off 122,000 tons. Gains were encouraging in the mining field. In the province of Quebec 1,427,221 tons were reported loaded during the month for a decrease of 190,694 or 12 p.c. with all groups lower. Pulpwood, oils, iron and steel, cement, beverages, fertilisers, newsprint, woodpulp, miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. declines contributed to the decrease. The total volume of revenue freight loaded in Ontario during January this year amounted to 2,871,189 tons which was 424,317 tons under the same month last year. All commodity groups were lower this January. Barley, flour, hogs, bituminous coal, coke, iron ore and other ores, and other mine products were less. Stone posted a good gain. Pulpwood deliveries shrank from 433,524 to 239,184 tons but logs were heavier. Gasoline and oils, pig iron, rails, iron and steel, agricultural implements, automobiles, newsprint, woodpulp and miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. were substantially reduced. In Manitoba sharply lower wheat, oats and barley loadings along with pulpwood off 49,358 tons, produced a decrease of 28.5 p.c. or 123,040 tons in the provincial total at 309,193 tons. Animal and mine totals improved along with manufactures. Heavier grain deliveries moved the Saskatchewan aggregate up from 1,208,546 to 1,391,728 tons as wheat gained 166,872 tons at 816,543 for the month. Barley, rye, flaxseed, flour, livestock, crude petroleum, salt, gasoline and oil and beverages contributed to the advance. Pulpwood was off from 38,465 to 8,658 tons. Alberta loadings reflected continued prosperity but a steep drop in coal produced a decrease of 19,807 tons in the provincial volume which aggregated 1,254,731 tons this January. Agricultural Products increased nearly 102,000 tons to 642,700 and animal products and manufactures were shipped in better volume. Wheat, barley, livestock, hogs, crude petroleum, gasoline, cement, and miscellaneous manufactures were featured. Total coal loadings dropped nearly 154,300 tons as compared with the previous January.

In the Coast Province a total of 795,604 tons were billed against 789,934 during the previous January. Forest products were much better up from 238,204 to 294,518 tons and discounted lighter volume in the other main groups. Apples were down sharply along with mill products, non-edible animal products, bituminous coal, fertilisers and woodpulp. Logs improved from 46,125 to 69,130 tons and lumber was up 17,085 tons to 193,899. Building products were moved in better volume this January.
