MONTHLY TRAFFIC REPORT OF RAILWAYS OF CANADA

Canadian lines carried 11,349,293 tons of revenue freight during February compared with the record 12,491,148 tons in the same month of 1952 which enjoyed an extra day. The overall decrease was thus 1,141,855 tons or 9.1 p.c., but on a daily average basis 5.9 p.c. The current total, however, is 143,763 tons above February of 1951. Domestic loadings totalled 8,603,994 tons this February against 9,412,310 tons last year while receipts from connections for domestic delivery amounted to 1,429,391 tons compared with 1,580,568 tons and intratransit freight slipped from 1,498,270 to 1,315,908 tons.

Provincial loadings in Canada show heavier volume this year in Prince Edward Island, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. The Newfoundland aggregate for February was 40,743 tons down only 1,392 tons from a year earlier with forest products lower. Increased potato loading in Prince Edward Island moved the provincial total up from 16,559 to 21,058 tons. The Nova Scotia grand total dropped 81,193 tons to 711,671 with mine and forest items reduced. New Brunswick with pulpwood shipments sharply lower skidded from 331,646 to 273,970 tons although mine products posted an improvement from 36,028 to 48,066 tons. The Quebec total moved down 158,251 tons from 1,547,053 to 1,388,802 or by 10.3 p.c. as only agricultural items registered a gain over February of 1952. With mine, forest and manufactures lower Ontario loaded 3,081,148 tons during February against 3,330,650 tons a year earlier off 7.5 p.c. The Manitoba aggregate shrank from 451,730 to 291,998 tons as grain and pulpwood loadings were pared considerably. Pulpwood dropped from 161,772 to 61,230 tons. Saskatchewan with a bumper grain crop to move reported 1,019,022 tons for the month against 974,161 a year earlier; mine and forest output was lower but agricultural items and manufactures were much heavier. Despite good advances in agriculture and animal products and in manufactures, the decrease of some 147,000 tons in mine items, principally coal, brought the Alberta total down from 1,035,210 to 907,518 tons in the current February. Forest products dropped from 64,967 to 33,597 tons.

Continued high activity on the West Coast resulted in loadings of 868,064 tons in British Columbia against 820,322 tons a year ago. Forestry products, notably lumber, sparked the advance. Mine output posted a minor gain as did manufactures but agriculture and animal products were reduced.

A comparison of total rail freight carried with that of the previous February shows wheat, barley, rye, other grain and flour ahead with corn, oats, other mill products, apples and fresh vegetables lower. The group total for agricultural products reflects an overall gain of 64,479 tons at 2,356,412. With meats, hogs, other packing house and animal products reduced, the Animal Products class decreased 50,189 tons to 114,271. Livestock was 3,852 tons greater to 20,359 tons. Heavy declines in all fuels, sand and gravel, crude petroleum and other mine products brought a drop of 461,089 tons or 12 p.c. in the mineral group, the total off from 3,839,985 to 3,378,896 tons. Forestry items showed heavier lumber deliveries as well as in logs and in plywood but pulpwood shipments were halved dropping 659,975 tons from the previous February to 650,680 tons and the group total at 1,535,656 was off 581,530 tons or 27.5 p.c.

Decreases predominated in manufactures and miscellaneous with the group down 113,526 tons from 4,077,584 to 3,964,058 tons. Gasoline, cement, automobiles, furniture, fertilizers and miscellaneous manufactures posted gains with foreign receipts of autos much better, the total up 24,082 tons to 228,819 tons. The major recessions were registered in loadings of pig iron, rails, beverages, other paper, wood pulp, fish, canned goods and L.C.L. Pig iron slipped from 131,103 to 81,663 tons while L.C.L. was 29,895 tons lighter at 188,435.

Reviewing Canadian loadings separately for the month, the current February reveals heavier volume in agricultural products, the group total up from 1,907,790 to 2,006,961 tons and in animals and animal products 1,943 tons greater at 84,025 tons. Mine products moved down from 2,675,170 to 2,375,120 tons due mainly to lighter coal shipments while domestic loadings of forest products declined nearly 550,000 tons under February, 1952 to 1,423,372 with the big decrease in pulpwood which dropped from 1,281,000 to 634,000 tons and offset gains in logs and lumber. The Canadian stations billed slightly less manufactures and miscellaneous but with the extra day in 1952, the showing for the month was encouraging; the group at 2,714,516 compared with 2,774,280 a year earlier. Gasoline, iron and steel, cement, fertilizers, other manufactures and miscellaneous were higher. Newspaper loadings on a daily basis were steady this February at 345,794 tons versus 355,405.

Cumulative freight volume handled for the first two months including domestic loadings and foreign receipts totalled 23,481,294 tons off 2,094,201 tons or 8.2 p.c. from the corresponding period of 1952 where fell an extra day. The present cumulative is slightly above January - February of 1951.
