RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

January, 1957

This is the first report of Railway Freight Traffic statistics presented on the basis of the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification prescribed by the Board of Transport Commissioners for use by all railways operating in Canada effective January 1, 1957. As a result of the adoption of the new classification, the commodities are now divided into 266 classes instead of 90. Consequently, comparable tonnage data, by commodity, is not available for the year 1956. However, a comparison of group totals is possible and these have been presented on pages two to six inclusive. One class 2 railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, was added to the list of reporting companies in 1957.

A total of 11,662,643 tons of revenue freight, of Canadian origin, was carried by 22 class 1 and 2 railways reporting for January 1957. This compares with 12,704,230 tons moved by 21 railways in January 1956 and reflects in large degree the effect of the nine-day strike against the Canadian Pacific Railway Company. Freight loaded at points in Canada, including receipts from water carriers, aggregated 8,989,409 tons during the month under review, down 7.4 per cent from 9,703,013 tons in January 1956. Receipts from U.S. rail connections were also lower with freight destined for delivery in Canada down to 1,174,603 tons from 1,360,712 and "in transit" shipments down to 1,498,631 tons from 1,640,505.

A provincial distribution of the freight movement during January shows that three provinces recorded an increased volume of traffic over the previous year. Newfoundland loadings rose 84.9 per cent to 83,491 tons from 45,150, due mainly to the inclusion of traffic carried by the Grand Falls Central Railway which reported for the first time. Increases were also apparent in Manitoba and Saskatchewan though to a much lesser degree. Greatest drops in loadings occurred in the provinces of Prince Edward Island and British Columbia, declining to 26,162 tons from 31,066 in the former and 740,499 from 957,295 tons in the latter. The drop in Prince Edward Island loadings was almost entirely due to reduced shipments of potatoes, while that in British Columbia was quite general in all commodity groups. Receipts from U.S. rail connections were fewer in all provinces, the decline being greatest in Alberta with a decrease of 47.8 per cent to 4,656 tons in January 1957 from 8,923 in January 1956.

Revenue freight totalling 11,668,357 tons terminated in Canada during January 1957, of which 8,844,900 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,823,457 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. In the previous year, 12,707,036 tons of freight terminated in Canada of which 9,566,364 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 3,140,672 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. Unloadings on a provincial basis declined in all but the province of Newfoundland where the amount of terminated freight rose 56.6 per cent to 95,048 tons from 60,703. Reductions throughout the remaining provinces ranged from 1.0 per cent in Ontario to 31.0 per cent in Prince Edward Island. Deliveries to U.S. rail connections declined to 2,823,457 tons in January 1957 compared with 3,140,672 in the previous year.
