RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER, 1957

The current report is based on the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways operating in Canada commencing January 1, 1957. Comparable 1956 data for the 266 individual commodity classes is not available but totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 railways reporting in this monthly series.

A total of 17,289,325 tons were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections during the month of October 1957, a decline of 7.2 per cent from 18,631,958 tons for the same month of 1956. Of the October 1957 total, 14,653,386 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including water-borne imports) as compared with 15,654,349 tons in 1956; 1,313,150 tons were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada in contrast to 1,515,091 tons in 1956; and 1,322,789 tons in contrast to 1,462,518 were received from United States rail connections for furtherance to the United States.

Carload freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: products of Agriculture, 2,357,563 tons (compared with 2,770,859 tons in 1956); animals and products, 126,085 tons (133,394); products of mines, 7,763,689 tons (7,801,926); products of forests, 1,082,373 tons (1,428,580); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,178,075 tons (3,349,445). Less than carload freight declined to 145,601 tons in contrast to 170,145 in 1956.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows decreases in eight of the ten provinces. Greatest tonnage declines occurred in Alberta, down 25.5 per cent to 1,176,042 tons from 1,579,556; New Brunswick, down 23.4 per cent to 340,144 tons from 444,158; and British Columbia, down 21.7 per cent to 932,111 tons from 1,190,600. Tonnage loaded in Saskatchewan rose 14.2 per cent to 1,428,783 tons from 1,251,320, and Quebec rose 4.7 per cent to 4,844,993 tons from 4,628,812.

During the month of October a total of 17,357,002 tons of freight terminated on railway lines with 14,667,753 tons being unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,689,249 tons delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 18,658,990 tons terminated in October 1956, of which 15,625,877 tons were unloaded at points in Canada, and 3,033,113 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first ten months of 1957, a total of 146,611,230 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections in contrast to 158,558,820 tons in 1956.
