RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER, 1957

The Railway Freight Traffic Statistics reports are being presented on the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways operating in Canada commencing January 1, 1957. Though comparable data for the 266 individual commodities is not available for 1956, totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing the total number of reporting railways to twenty-two.

During the month of November a total of 14,178,904 tons of freight were loaded in Canada or were received from United States rail connections, a decline of 11.9 per cent from 16,086,690 tons for the same month of 1956. Of the November 1957 total, 11,902,640 tons (including water-borne imports) were loaded at points in Canada as against 13,296,984 tons in 1956. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points totalled 1,076,868 tons as compared with 1,443,472 while intransit freight or that received from U.S. rail connections for furtherance to the United States amounted to 1,199,396 tons in contrast to 1,346,234 a year earlier.

Freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: products of agriculture, 2,378,307 tons (versus 2,501,051 in 1956); animals and products, 143,524 tons (128,330); products of mines, 5,312,298 tons (6,090,594); products of forests, 944,464 tons (1,260,265); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,978,582 tons (3,159,108). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 145,460 tons from 157,636 in 1956.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows declines in volume in six of the ten provinces. Greatest decreases in the amount of freight handled occurred in the following: British Columbia, down 26.1 per cent to 817,590 tons from 1,106,144 in 1956; New Brunswick, down 25.5 per cent to 302,371 tons from 406,053; and Nova Scotia, down 19.4 per cent to 784,222 tons from 973,016. Loadings in Saskatchewan rose 11.7 per cent to 1,435,874 tons from 1,286,022, while in Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island and Manitoba loadings increased only slightly.

During the month under review a total of 14,232,841 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 11,807,164 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,425,677 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 16,220,800 tons terminated in November 1956, of which 13,298,340 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,922,460 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

For the first eleven months of 1957, a total of 160,790,134 tons of freight were loaded at points in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections. This compares with 174,645,510 tons loaded during the same period of 1956.
