RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER, 1957

The Railway Freight Traffic Statistics presented in this report are in accordance with the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which has been the basis for reporting by all railways during the year 1957. An individual breakdown of data for the 266 commodity classes is not available for 1956. However, totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 railways reporting in this monthly series.

During December 11,552,896 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections. This was a decline of 11.9 per cent from the 13,113,852 tons handled during the same month one year earlier. Of the December 1957 total, 9,375,114 tons (including water-borne imports) were loaded on lines in Canada, down from 10,454,698 tons in 1956. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to Canadian points totalled 896,515 tons as compared with 1,158,877, while freight received from United States rail connections for furtherance to United States points amounted to 1,281,267 tons in contrast to 1,500,277.

Carload freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: products of agriculture, 2,159,332 tons (as against 2,063,331 in 1956); animals and products, 125,984 (111,881); products of mines, 3,272,754 (3,846,230); products of forests, 989,567 (1,224,027); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,727,562 (3,080,513). Less than carload freight declined to 99,915 tons from 128,716.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows a decrease in volume carried in eight of the ten provinces. British Columbia loadings fell 31.6 per cent to 687,997 tons from 1,006,097 while New Brunswick with the second largest decline fell 25.4 per cent to 302,740 tons from 405,609. Other decreases in traffic occurred in Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta. Loadings in Newfoundland rose 65.2 per cent to 79,991 tons from 48,410, while Saskatchewan rose 4.4 per cent to 1,209,879 tons from 1,159,432.

Revenue freight terminating in Canada during the month of December totalled 11,621,523 tons, of which 8,999,234 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,622,289 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,939,083 tons terminated in the previous December, of which 9,842,425 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 3,096,658 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

For the twelve months of 1957 a total of 172,343,030 tons of freight were loaded at points in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections. This was a decline of 8.2 per cent from the 187,759,362 tons loaded during the same period of 1956.
