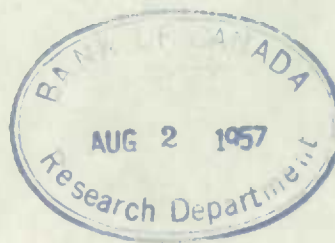

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

February, 1957

This Railway Freight Traffic report is the second to be presented on the basis of the expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted for use by all railways in 1957. Though comparable tonnage data for the 266 classes is not available for the year 1956, totals have been presented for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, was added in the current year bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 carriers reporting in 1957.

A total of 12,689,798 tons of revenue freight originated in Canada during the month, down 1.7 per cent from the 12,911,842 tons carried in the same period a year earlier. However, commodities loaded at points in Canada, which includes receipts from water carriers, rose slightly to 9,971,571 tons from 9,958,117. Receipts from United States rail connections were lower this February with freight destined for delivery to Canadian points down to 1,205,692 tons from 1,395,139 and destinations to U.S. points, or "in transit" traffic, down to 1,512,535 tons from 1,558,586.

A breakdown of the freight movement by province, shows decreased loadings of 14.9 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 10.2 per cent in Manitoba; 15.2 per cent in Saskatchewan; and 8.6 per cent in British Columbia. The most significant increase occurred in the province of Newfoundland where the inclusion of traffic carried by the Grand Falls Central Railway contributed to a 41.6 per cent rise in loadings which were predominantly newsprint paper and other manufactures and miscellaneous commodities. Receipts from U.S. rail connections were fewer in all provinces except Manitoba where 67,614 tons of freight were received during February compared with 47,505 a year earlier.

Revenue freight terminating in Canada during the month under review totalled 12,743,448 tons, of which 9,678,988 were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 3,064,460 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. In February 1956, a total tonnage of 12,954,989 terminated in Canada with 9,767,656 tons being unloaded at points in Canada and 3,187,333 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections. A decline of 8.9 per cent in Ontario unloadings more than offset gains which occurred in all but the provinces of Quebec, Ontario and Saskatchewan.

The amount of revenue freight originated by the 22 class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada for the first two months of 1957, totalled 24,352,441 tons compared with 25,616,072 a year earlier. Manufactures and miscellaneous was the only commodity group to register an increase over the previous year, rising to 8,510,811 tons over the two-month period as against 8,377,805 in 1956.
