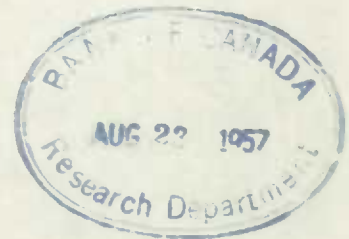

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

March, 1957

The current report is presented on the basis of the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways in 1957. Consequently, tonnages by similar commodity classes are not available for 1956. However, totals for each of the six commodity groups are presented for that year. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 carriers whose statistics appear herein.

During the month of March, 12,581,641 tons of revenue freight originated on railways operating in Canada compared with 12,797,996 tons in the same month of 1956. Of the March, 1957 total, 9,780,735 tons (including waterborne imports) were loaded at points in Canada as against 9,882,771; 1,186,333 tons were re-received from United States rail connections for unloading in Canada, down from 1,311,540; and 1,614,573 tons, in contrast to 1,603,685, was intransit freight or that received from U.S. rail connections for furtherance to U.S. destinations.

Carload freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: agricultural products, 1,533,110 tons in March 1957 as against 1,913,591 a year earlier; animals and products, 86,702 tons as against 101,796; products of mines, 3,172,600 tons as against 2,980,381; products of forests, 1,661,823 tons as against 1,616,845; and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,195,569 tons as against 3,128,888. Less than carload freight amounted to 130,931 tons in the month under review down from 141,270 in the previous March.

A provincial breakdown of the freight movement shows a decline in traffic for six of the ten provinces. Prince Edward Island loadings fell 27.4 per cent to 29,434 tons from 40,539, while Saskatchewan with the second largest decline in volume fell 17.3 per cent to 706,033 tons from 853,927. Decreases were also registered in New Brunswick, Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia though to a lesser degree. An increased freight movement was reported in Newfoundland, up 51.3 per cent; Alberta, up 15.2 per cent; Nova Scotia, up 6.5 per cent; and Quebec, up 0.4 per cent.

Revenue freight totalling 12,655,971 tons terminated in Canada during March 1957, of which 9,444,757 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 3,211,214 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. In March 1956, 12,784,491 tons of freight terminated in Canada of which 9,540,510 tons were unloaded at points in the Dominion and 3,243,981 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections.
