## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

April, 1957

The Railway Freight Traffic Statistics reports are being presented on the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways operating in Canada effective January 1, 1957. Though comparable tonnage data is not available for the 266 classes in 1956, totals have been presented for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing the total number of reporting railways to twenty-two. The class 1 and 2 companies whose statistics are presented in this report are as follows:

A total of 12,806,535 tons of revenue freight originated on railway lines in Canada during the month of April, down 5.6 per cent from 13,567,759 tons for the same month in 1956. Of the total tons originated 9,990,107 tons were loaded at points in Canada, down from 10,661,278 loaded in 1956; 1,287,546 tons were received from U.S. rail destined to points in Canada as compared with 1,402,960; and destinations to U.S. points, or "intransit" freight rose to 1,528,882 tons from 1,503,521.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows declines in seven of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan loadings fell 31.3 per cent to 823,931 tons from 1,199,236, while Manitoba with the second largest decline fell 15.4 per cent to 498,157 tons from 588,567. Other decreases occurred in Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia. Loadings in Newfoundland increased 23.9 per cent to 91,321 tons from 73,687 while Nova Scotia and Quebec increased slightly.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the month totalled 12,896,252 tons of which 9,924,169 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,972,083 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. In April 1956 a total tonnage of 13,630,082 tons terminated in Canada with 10,683,929 tons unloaded at points in Canada and 2,946,153 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections.
