RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

May, 1957

The current report is presented on the basis of the new expanded Freight commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways in 1957. Consequently, tonnages by similar commodity classes are not available for 1956. However, totals for each of the six commodity groups are presented for that year. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 carriers reporting in 1957.

During the month of May, 15,016,189 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada or were received from U.S. rail connections. This compares with 16,266,372 tons for the same month of 1956. Of the May 1957 total, 12,431,194 tons (including water-borne) were loaded at points in Canada as against 13,396,955 loaded in 1956; 1,242,982 tons were received from United States rail connections destined to Canadian points down from 1,368,141; and 1,342,013 tons, in contrast to 1,501,276, was intran- sit freight or that received from United States rail connections for furtherance to the United States.

Carload freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commod- ity groups was: Agricultural products, 2,250,076 tons in May 1957 as against 3,002,- 509 in May 1956; animals and products, 94,425 tons as against 106,295; products of mines, 5,427,349 tons as against 5,417,236; products of forests 1,027,805 tons as against 1,071,300; and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,472,001 tons as against 3,620,806. Less than carload freight amounted to 159,538 tons down from 178,809 a year earlier.

A provincial breakdown of the freight movement shows a decline in traffic for eight of the ten provinces. New Brunswick loadings were down 16.3 per cent to 350,749 tons from 418,517 and Saskatchewan with the second largest decline fell 14.3 per cent to 1,465,322 tons from 1,709,032. Other decreases were in Nova Scotia, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Alberta and British Columbia. Newfoundland registered an increase of 26.1 per cent to 125,155 tons from 99,264 and Prince Edward Island rose slightly by 0.6 per cent to 39,754 tons from 39,520.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the month of May, 1957 amounted to 15,052,175 tons of which 12,478,587 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (includ- ing deliveries to water carriers) and 2,573,588 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 16,267,369 tons terminated in May 1956 of which 13,474,018 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,793,351 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.
