## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY, 1957

The current report is presented on the basis of the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways operating in Canada commencing January 1, 1957. Though comparable 1956 tonnage data is not available for the 266 individual commodities, totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing the total number of reporting railways to twenty-two.

During the month of July, 17,035,828 tons were loaded in Canada or were received from U.S. rail connections. This was a decline of 6.0 per cent from 18,123,901 tons for the same month of 1956. Of the July 1957 total, 14,503,132 tons (which includes water-borne imports) were loaded at points in Canada as against 15,587,219; 1,264,347 tons were received from U.S. rail connections for unloading in Canada, up from 1,212,615; and 1,268,349 tons, in contrast to 1,324,067, was intransit freight or that received from U.S. rail connections for furtherance to the United States.

Carload freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: agricultural products, 2,051,301 tons in July 1957 as against 2,674,378 a year earlier; animals and products, 97,432 tons as against 102,385; products of mines, 7,406,289 tons as against 7,783,626; products of forests, 1,530,393 tons as against 1,620,452; and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,269,665 as against 3,253,884. Less than carload freight amounted to 148,052 tons in the current month down from 152,494 in the previous July.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows declines in seven of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan loadings fell 21.5 per cent to 1,225,649 tons from 1,561,566, while New Brunswick with the second largest decline in volume fell 14.0 per cent to 315,495 tons from 366,689. Decreases were also registered in Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia. Loadings in Newfoundland, where traffic carried by the Grand Falls Central is included rose 24.9 per cent to 271,695 tons from 217,450, Manitoba increased 2.8 per cent to 760,582 tons from 740,150, and Nova Scotia rose slightly to 1,013,076 tons from 1,003,028.

Revenue freight totalling 17,203,279 tons terminated in Canada during July 1957, of which 14,654,813 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,548,466 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. In July 1956, 18,433,361 tons of freight terminated in Canada of which 15,630,341 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,803,020 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

From January 1 to July 31, 1957 a total of 96,622,941 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) or were received from U.S. rail connections. In comparison, 103,572,635 tons were loaded during the like period one year earlier.
