RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

AUGUST, 1957

Commencing January 1, 1957 Railway Freight Traffic Statistics have been reported in accordance with the expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification. Though comparable data for the 266 individual commodities is not available for 1956, totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. The Grand Falls Central Railway in Newfoundland has been added in 1957, bringing to twenty-two the number of class 1 and 2 railways reporting in this monthly series.

During the month of August a total of 16,679,575 tons were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections, a decline of 12.4 per cent from 19,036,645 for the same month one year earlier. Of the August 1957 total, 14,096,770 tons (including water-borne imports) were loaded at points in Canada as compared with 16,455,205 tons loaded in 1956; 1,216,439 tons were received from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points, in contrast to 1,201,729; and 1,366,366 as against 1,379,711 tons were intransit freight, or that received from U.S. rail connections destined to the U.S.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows declines in eight of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan loadings fell 34.2 per cent to 1,097,658 tons from 1,667,520, while British Columbia with the second largest decline fell 27.3 per cent to 916,116 tons from 1,259,318. Other decreases in traffic occurred in Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta. Loadings in Prince Edward Island rose 25.1 per cent to 11,140 tons from 8,907, while in Nova Scotia the volume rose only slightly to 912,115 tons from 911,558.

Revenue freight terminating in Canada during the month under review totalled 16,724,035 tons, of which 14,110,278 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,613,757 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 19,047,331 tons terminated in August 1956 of which 16,145,415 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,901,916 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

During the first eight months of 1957, a total of 113,302,516 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) or were received from U.S. rail connections, in contrast to 122,609,280 tons for the same period one year earlier.
