RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER, 1957

The Railway Freight Traffic Statistics reports are being presented on the new expanded Freight Commodity Statistics Classification which was adopted for use by all railways operating in Canada effective January 1, 1957. Though comparable data for the 266 individual commodities is not available for 1956, totals have been given for each of the six commodity groups. One railway, the Grand Falls Central in Newfoundland, has been added in 1957 bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 railways reporting in this monthly series.

During the month of September a total of 16,019,389 tons were loaded in Canada or were received from United States rail connections, a decline of 7.5 per cent from 17,317,582 tons for the same month of 1956. Of the September 1957 total, 13,688,490 tons (including water-borne imports) were loaded at points in Canada as compared with 14,864,274 tons loaded in 1956; 1,143,561 tons were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada in contrast to 1,213,210 tons in 1956; and 1,187,338 tons as against 1,240,098 tons were intransit freight, or that received from United States rail connections for furtherance to the United States.

Freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: agricultural products, 1,782,111 tons in September 1957 as compared with 2,372,961 tons a year earlier; animals and animal products, 106,928 as against 108,033; products of mines, 7,551,028 tons as against 7,644,650; products of forests, 1,125,607 tons as against 1,488,095; and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,979,438 tons as against 3,086,978. Less than carload freight amounted to 143,378 tons in the current month down from 163,557 in the previous September.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows declines in nine of the ten provinces. Greatest decreases in the volume of freight handled occurred in British Columbia, down 22.4 per cent to 897,650 tons from 1,157,293; Newfoundland, down 19.8 per cent to 142,190 tons from 177,303; and Saskatchewan, down 18.4 per cent to 1,174,582 tons from 1,439,909. Nova Scotia recorded a slight increase to 950,926 tons from 943,702.

Revenue freight terminating in Canada during the month under review totalled 16,120,108 tons, of which 13,617,793 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,502,315 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 17,351,540 tons terminated in September 1956 of which 14,622,596 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,728,944 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first nine months of 1957 a total of 129,321,905 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) or were received from United States rail connections. This compares with 139,926,862 tons for the same period one year earlier.
