## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JANUARY, 1958

Presented in this report are railway freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (those having average gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more). One railway, the British Columbia Electric, has been added as of January 1, 1958, while the Hudson Bay Railway has been absorbed into the operations of the Canadian National Railway System. Although the number of reporting authorities remains the same, this series now provides wider coverage.

During the month of January, 11,182,708 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections. This was a decline of 4.1 per cent from 11,662,643 tons handled during the similar period in 1957. Some 8,966,681 tons or 80.2 per cent (as against 8,989,409 or 77.1 per cent in January, 1957) were loaded on lines in Canada, including waterborne imports; 934,007 tons or 8.4 per cent, (1,174,603 or 10.1 per cent) were received from U.S. rail destined to Canadian points; and 1,282,020 tons or 11.4 per cent, (1,498,631 or 12.8 per cent) was intransit traffic (United States to United States through Canada)

Products of mines loaded in Canada in January 1958 amounted to 3,016,985 tons (3,042,493 a year earlier). Bituminous coal was the principal commodity handled during both periods, accounting for 1,183,617 tons or 39.2 per cent of the January 1958 total and 1,149,651 or 37.8 per cent in 1957. Products of agriculture movements increased to 1,835,419 tons from 1,790,564 with wheat loadings providing 1,085,891 or 59.2 per cent of the total tonnage in the current year as against 874,635 or 48.8 per cent a year ago. Products of forests loaded or originated in Canada rose slightly to 1,101,565 tons from 1,099,990 with pulpwood and lumber being the main commodities carried in both years. Animals and products were also moved in greater volume during January, while manufactures and miscellaneous tonnage showed a slight decline. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) shipments fell to 94,538 from 107,172 tons.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada indicates declines in six of the ten provinces. Newfoundland, British Columbia, New Brunswick, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta registered decreases in traffic ranging downward from 22.0 per cent. Loadings in Prince Edward Island and Ontario rose 19.4 and 8.5 per cent while in Nova Scotia and Quebec the volume of traffic rose to a lesser degree.

During the month of January, 11,220,703 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. This compares with 11,668,357 tons during the same period of 1957.
