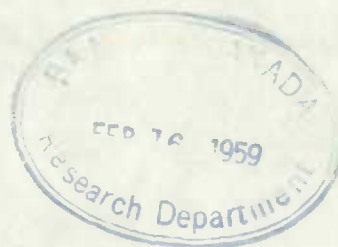

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

October, 1958

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. The British Columbia Electric Railway, which reported for the first time in January 1958 is not included in comparable data for 1957. As of January 1, 1958 the Hudson Bay Railway has been absorbed into the Canadian National System.

During the month of October, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 15,107,665 tons, a decline of 12.6 per cent from 17,289,325 tons handled in the same period one year earlier. Of the October 1958 total, 13,007,572 tons (14,653,386 in 1957) were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports); 964,744 tons (1,313,150) were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada; and 1,135,349 tons (1,322,789) were intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada).

Freight loadings in Canada, as divided among the main commodity groups, were as follows: products of agriculture, 2,420,076 tons (as against 2,357,563 in 1957); animals and products, 129,301 tons (126,085); products of mines, 5,967,800 tons (7,763,689); products of forests, 1,171,435 tons (1,082,373); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,206,769 tons (3,178,075). Less than carload freight dropped to 112,191 tons from 145,601.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada shows declines in six of the ten provinces. The major decreases occurred in Quebec and Ontario where the volume fell 26.4 and 12.7 per cent, respectively. Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, New Brunswick and Saskatchewan loadings declined to a lesser degree. Commodity movements were greater in four provinces with Prince Edward Island registering a 19.1 per cent increase; British Columbia 17.8 per cent; Alberta 10.5 per cent and Manitoba 6.8 per cent.

During the month under review a total of 15,195,473 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 12,622,021 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,573,452 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 17,357,002 tons terminated in October 1957 of which 14,667,753 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,689,249 were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

During the first ten months of 1958 revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 128,763,912 tons in contrast to 146,611,230 tons for the same period a year earlier.
