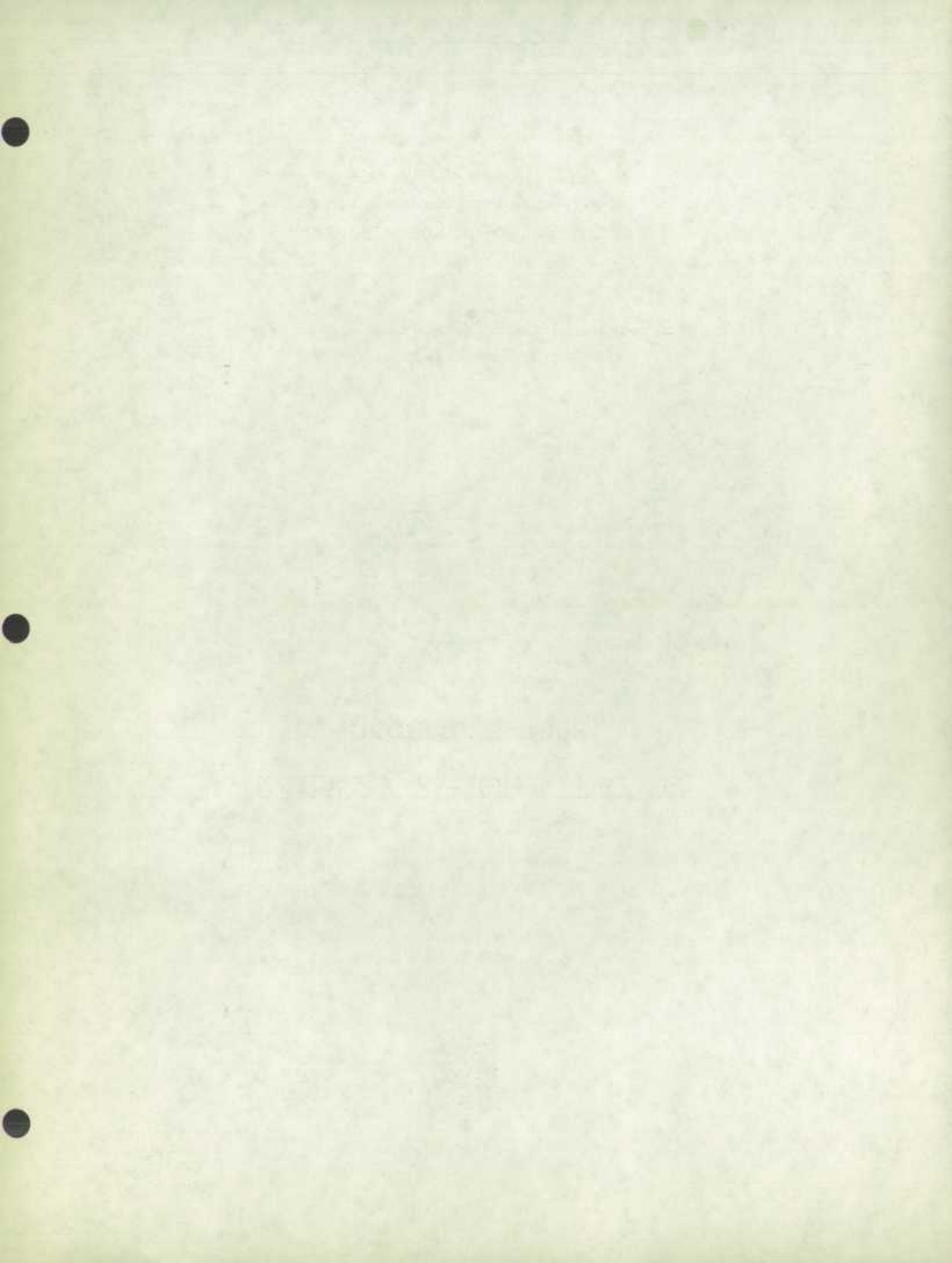

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

December, 1958

Presented in this report are the revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually).

During December 1958 a total of 11,177,099 tons of revenue freight was handled in Canada consisting of 9,144,671 tons loaded at points in the Dominion and 2,032,428 tons received from United States rail connections. By comparison, 11,552,896 tons were handled a year earlier, 9,375,114 tons of which were loaded in Canada and 2,177,782 tons received from U.S. rail connections.

In the month under review, loadings of mine products totalled 2,993,395 tons, down 8.5 per cent from 3,272,754 a year earlier, while manufactures and miscellaneous increased 5.5 per cent to 2,878,208 tons from 2,727,562. The volume of agricultural products fell slightly to 2,123,836 tons from 2,159,332 as did products of forests which dropped to 964,184 tons from 989,567. Animal products and l.c.l. (less than car-load) freight movements were also lighter during the current December.

A provincial breakdown of the total freight loaded shows that tonnages fell 16.2 per cent in Ontario to 2,601,465 from 3,104,429; 11.5 per cent in Alberta to 990,489 tons from 1,119,224; and 11.3 per cent in Newfoundland to 70,940 tons from 79,991. In British Columbia, loadings rose sharply to 872,558 tons from 687,997 or by 26.8 per cent. Increases ranging downward from 9.3 per cent were also registered in the volume of freight loaded in New Brunswick, Manitoba, Quebec, Saskatchewan and Nova Scotia.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 11,261,245 tons during December 1958 in contrast to 11,621,523 a year earlier. In the current month, 8,752,523 tons (8,999,234 in 1957) were unloaded at points in Canada, while 2,508,722 tons (2,622,289) were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

During the year 1958, class 1 and 2 railways loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, a total of 152,051,381 tons of revenue freight, a decline of 11.8 per cent from the 172,343,030 tons carried in 1957.
