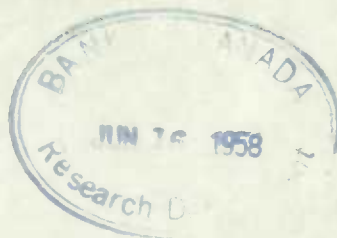

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

February, 1958

This report presents statistics of freight traffic handled by class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. One railway, the British Columbia Electric, has been added as of January 1, 1958, while the Hudson Bay Railway has been absorbed into the Canadian National Railway System.

During the month of February, 10,085,244 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections, a decline of 20.5 per cent from 12,689,773 tons for the same month one year earlier. Of the February 1958 total, 8,115,291 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including water-borne imports) in contrast to 9,971,571 tons loaded in 1957. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 860,252 tons as compared with 1,205,692, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,109,701 tons as against 1,512,535 in 1957.

Freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups was: products of agriculture, 1,523,015 tons (as compared with 1,826,156 in 1957); animals and products, 86,671 tons (85,871); products of mines, 2,634,565 tons, (3,241,524); products of forests, 1,194,744 tons (1,631,917); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,582,041 tons (3,059,962). Less than carload freight declined to 94,255 tons from 126,141.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada shows declines in nine of the ten provinces. The greatest of these occurred in New Brunswick, down 28.4 per cent to 338,987 tons from 473,683; Quebec, down 25.9 per cent to 1,356,797 tons from 1,832,047; and Newfoundland down 25.4 per cent to 57,829 tons from 77,545. Tonnage loaded in Prince Edward Island rose 10.4 per cent to 33,180 tons from 30,048, due mainly to an increased movement of agricultural products.

During the month under review, a total of 10,113,644 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 7,757,510 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,356,134 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 12,743,448 tons terminated in February 1957, of which 9,678,988 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 3,064,460 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

For the first two months of 1958, a total of 21,268,037 tons of freight were loaded in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections as compared with 24,352,441 tons in the previous year.
