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## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

March, 1958

This report presents statistics of freight traffic handled by Class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. One railway, the British Columbia Electric was added as of January 1, 1958, while the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National Railway System.

During March, 10,888,180 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada or were received from United States rail connections. This represents a decline of 13.5 per cent from 12,581,641 tons for the same month last year. Of this March 1958 total, 8,660,907 tons were loaded on lines in Canada as compared with 9,780,735 tons in March, 1957. 952,408 tons of freight were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada in contrast to 1,186,333 tons for the same period a year ago, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) dropped from 1,614,573 tons in March, 1957 to 1,274,865 tons in the current month.

A breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada for the main commodity groups shows: products of agriculture, 1,596,989 tons (1,533,110 in 1957); animals and products, 96,865 tons (86,702); products of mines, 2,733,940 tons (3,172,600); products of forests, 1,160,747 tons (1,661,823); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,963,298 tons (3,195,569). Less than carload (l.c.l.) freight eased down to 109,068 tons from 130,931.

All provinces except Prince Edward Island again registered declines from the March, 1957 tonnage totals of freight loaded in Canada. Newfoundland dropped 22.8 per cent to 73,991 tons from 95,895; Alberta fell by 21.3 per cent to 822,420 tons from 1,044,398 while British Columbia loaded 846,711 tons as compared with 1,072,346 last year, a decrease of 21.0 per cent. Prince Edward Island's freight traffic on the other hand, increased from 29,434 tons last year to a current figure of 43,513 tons for a rise of 47.8 per cent, once again brought about mainly by an increase in the volume of agricultural products moved.

During March of this year, 8,233,044 tons of revenue freight were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers), while 2,732,258 tons were delivered to United States rail connections, for a total of 10,965,302 tons terminated by railway lines in Canada. By comparison, 12,655,971 tons terminated in Canada in March, 1957 of which 9,444,757 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 3,211,214 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first quarter of 1958, a total of 32,156,217 tons of freight were loaded in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections as compared with 36,934,082 tons in the corresponding quarter of 1957.
