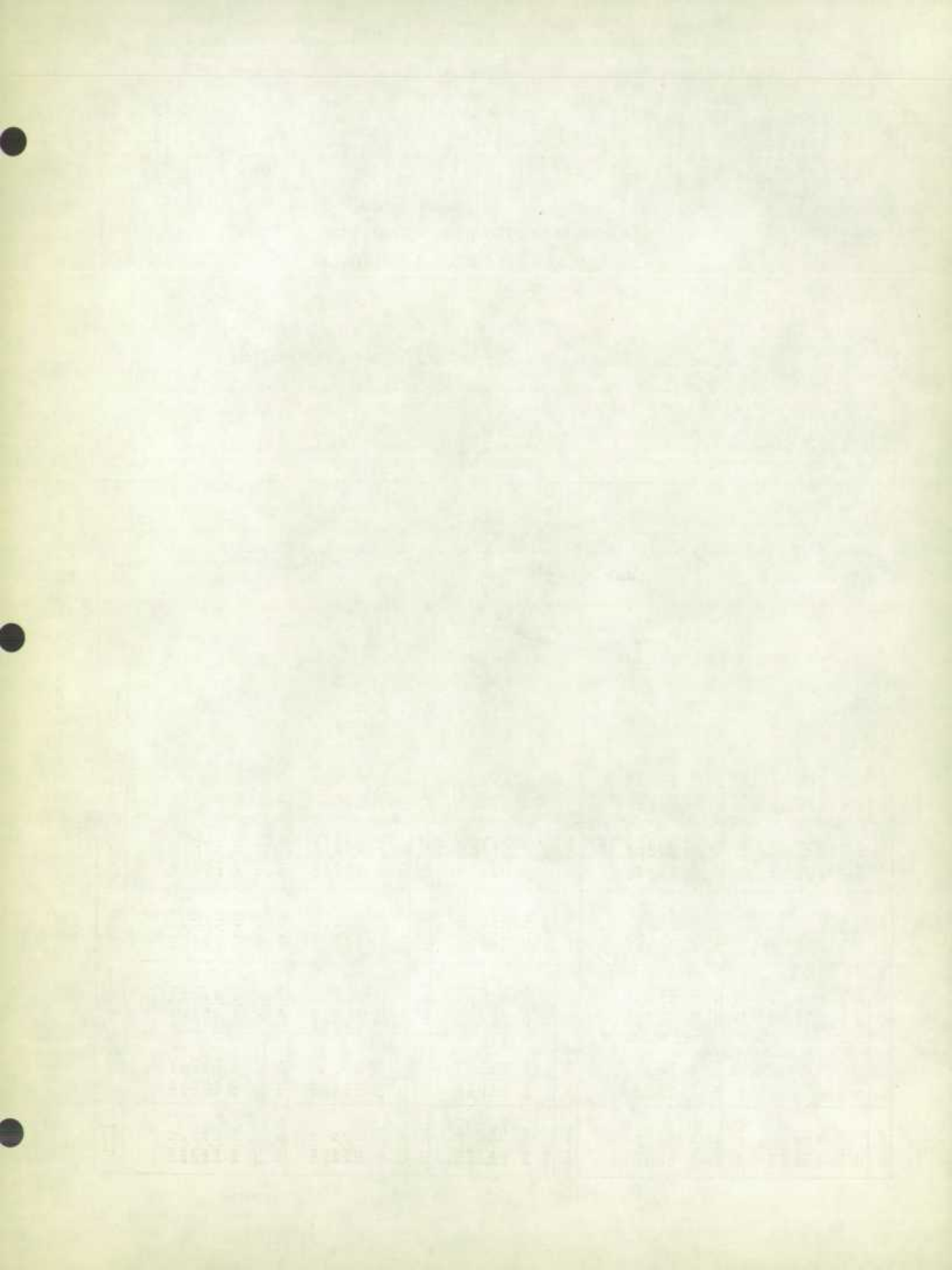

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

April, 1958

Presented in this report are railway freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. One railway, the British Columbia Electric, has been added as of January 1, 1958, while the Hudson Bay Railway has been absorbed into the Canadian National Railway System.

During the month of April a total of 11,087,438 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada or were received from United States rail connections, a decline of 13.4 per cent from 12,806,258 tons handled during the same month of 1957. Of the April 1958 total, 9,013,386 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 9,990,107 tons loaded in 1957. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 917,276 tons as compared with 1,287,546, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,156,776 tons in contrast to 1,528,882 in the previous year.

Freight loaded at points in Canada as divided among the main commodity groups showed the following tonnages: products of agriculture, 1,751,310 (as against 1,649,004 in 1957); animals and products, 90,373 (98,913); products of mines, 3,196,491 (3,627,240); products of forests, 749,153 (1,092,963); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,102,892 (3,356,996). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 123,167 tons from 164,991.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada indicated declines in all provinces except Prince Edward Island. Loadings in British Columbia decreased by 25.9 per cent to 778,441 tons from 1,050,807; Nova Scotia, 22.5 per cent to 687,285 tons from 886,472; Newfoundland, 21.2 per cent to 72,001 tons from 91,321; and New Brunswick, 20.1 per cent to 262,129 tons from 328,003. Tonnage loaded in Prince Edward Island rose 16.1 per cent to 44,677 from 38,496.

During the month under review, a total of 11,176,327 tons of freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this amount, 8,841,505 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers), while 2,334,822 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 12,896,252 tons were terminated on lines in Canada in April, 1957 of which 9,924,169 tons were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,972,083 tons were delivered to the United States.

For the first four months of 1958, a total of 43,243,655 tons of freight were loaded in Canada (including water-borne imports) or were received from United States rail connections, in contrast to 49,740,340 tons in the like period a year earlier.
