RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

May, 1958

Presented in this report are railway freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (those having average gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more). One railway, the British Columbia Electric, was added as of January 1, 1958, while the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National System.

During the month of May, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada or received from United States rail connections totalled 13,446,224 tons or 10.5 per cent less than the 15,016,189 handled in the same period of 1957. Of the May, 1958 tonnage, 11,497,647 (12,431,194 in 1957) were loaded in Canada, 835,661 tons (1,242,982) were received from United States rail destined to points in the Dominion, and 1,112,916 tons (1,342,013) were intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada).

Products of mines loaded in Canada during May amounted to 4,404,554 tons in contrast to 5,427,349 in 1957. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled during both periods, accounting for 817,277 tons in May 1958 and 1,565,033 in the previous year. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements declined to 3,169,691 tons from 3,472,001 with gasoline and newsprint paper being the main items carried in both years. Products of agriculture loaded or originated in Canada rose slightly to 2,809,054 tons from 2,250,076 with wheat loadings providing 1,809,354 tons in the current year as against 1,398,290 a year earlier. Products of forests declined to 965,465 tons from 1,027,805 and animals and products fell to 80,668 tons from 94,425. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) shipments dropped sharply to 68,215 tons from 159,538.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada shows a decline in six of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia, Ontario, New Brunswick, Quebec, British Columbia and Alberta registered decreases in traffic ranging downward from 22.5 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland and Manitoba rose 43.0 and 36.2 per cent respectively, while in Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan the volume of traffic increased to a lesser degree.

During the month of May, 13,558,957 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada, 11,320,578 tons of which were unloaded at points in Canada and 2,238,379 delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with tonnages of 15,052,175, 12,478,587 and 2,573,588 respectively for May 1957.

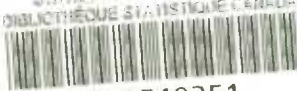
