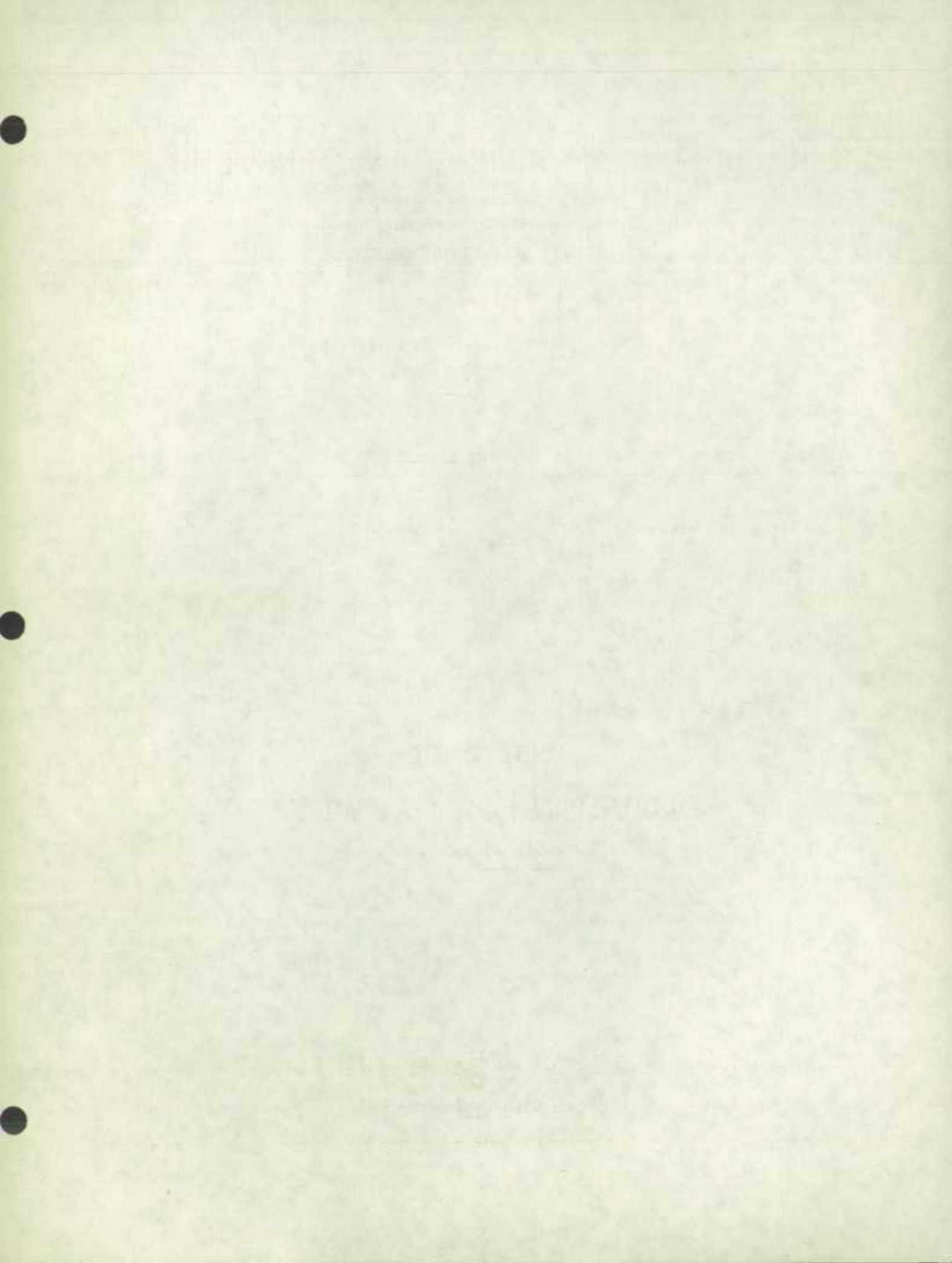

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

June, 1958

Statistics of the British Columbia Electric Railway, which reported for the first time in January, 1958, are not included in the comparable 1957 totals shown in this report. As of January 1, 1958 the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National System.

During the month of June a total of 14,744,831 tons of revenue freight was handled by the railways, a slight decline from 14,830,584 tons a year earlier. Of the June 1958 total, 12,864,483 tons (12,520,703 in 1957) were loaded in Canada; 841,247 tons (1,123,233) were received from United States rail connections destined to points in the Dominion; and 1,039,101 tons (1,186,648) were intransit movements, or United States to United States through Canada.

Products of mines accounted for 5,638,930 tons (6,125,235) or 43.8 per cent (48.9) of all freight loaded in Canada during June and of this amount, 2,499,680 (2,464,286) and 1,874,796 tons (2,118,636) originated in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario, respectively. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements totalled 2,919,442 tons (2,970,595) and these were also loaded in greatest volume in Ontario and Quebec. The principal articles handled in this commodity group were gasoline and newsprint paper. Products of agriculture loaded by railways in Canada aggregated 2,895,629 tons (1,916,635) during June with shipments of wheat, loaded for the most part in the province of Saskatchewan, contributing 1,891,176 tons (1,264,845) to the total. Forest products, loaded mainly in British Columbia, Quebec and Ontario, totalled 1,219,746 tons (1,293,967) and the volume of animals and products carried amounted to 84,145 tons (85,422).

During June 1958, a total of 12,638,847 tons of freight was unloaded by lines in Canada, while 2,151,886 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,461,859 and 2,313,687 tons, respectively, during the same month of 1957.
