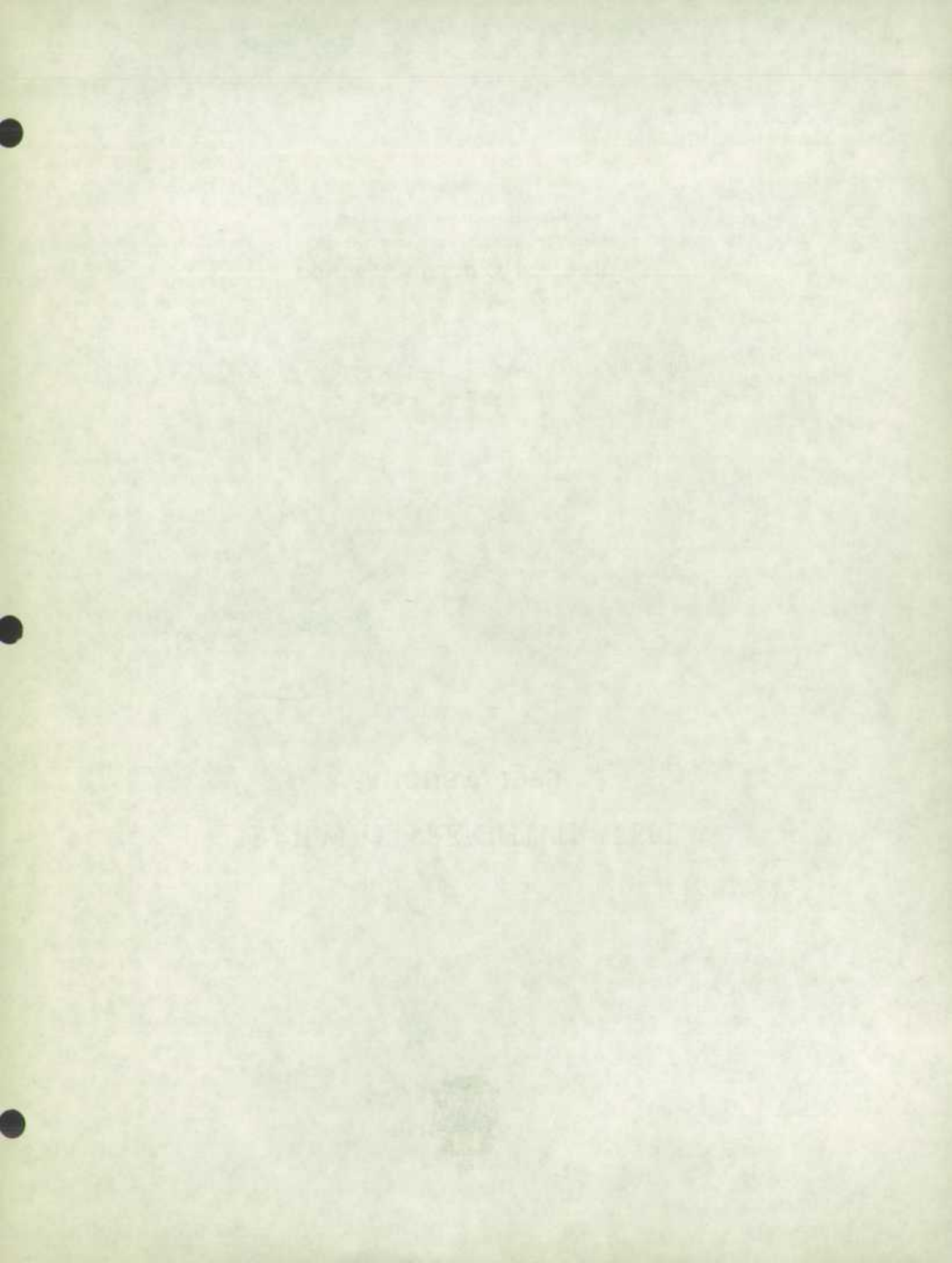

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

August, 1958

Presented in this report are freight traffic statistics of all class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. The British Columbia Electric, which reported for the first time in January 1958, is not included in the comparable 1957 data. As of January 1, 1958 the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National System.

During the month of August 13,461,307 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decline of 19.3 per cent from 16,679,575 tons handled during the same month of 1957. Of the August 1958 total, 11,634,685 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 14,096,770 tons loaded in 1957. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 781,466 tons as compared with 1,216,439, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,045,156 tons in contrast to 1,366,366 in the previous year.

Products of mines loaded in Canada during August amounted to 5,751,381 tons, down from 7,535,054 a year ago. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled during both periods accounting for 2,388,187 tons in August 1958 and 3,447,772 in the previous year. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements declined to 2,830,618 tons from 3,148,531 with gasoline and newsprint paper being the main items carried. Products of agriculture loaded or originated in Canada dropped to 1,686,961 tons from 1,822,206 with wheat loadings contributing 1,083,361 tons in the current year as against 1,143,021 tons previously. Products of forests declined to 1,166,708 tons from 1,344,836 and animals and products fell to 87,758 tons from 103,116. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) shipments dropped to 111,259 tons from 143,027.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded in Canada shows declines in eight of the ten provinces. The greatest of these occurred in Nova Scotia where loadings dropped 49.0 per cent to 465,132 tons from 912,115, due mainly to decreased movements of bituminous coal and crude gypsum. Quebec reported the second largest decline, dropping 23.9 per cent to 3,742,854 tons from 4,918,416. Loadings in Newfoundland rose 5.3 per cent to 187,715 tons from 178,259 and Saskatchewan increased 6.2 per cent to 1,165,201 tons from 1,097,658.

During the month under review a total of 13,552,327 tons of revenue freight terminated on lines in Canada. Of this total, 11,344,409 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,207,918 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 16,724,035 tons terminated in August 1957; of which 14,110,278 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,613,757 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first eight months of 1958 a total of 99,574,325 tons of freight was loaded in Canada (including water-borne imports) and received from United States rail connections. This compares with 113,302,516 tons in the previous year.
