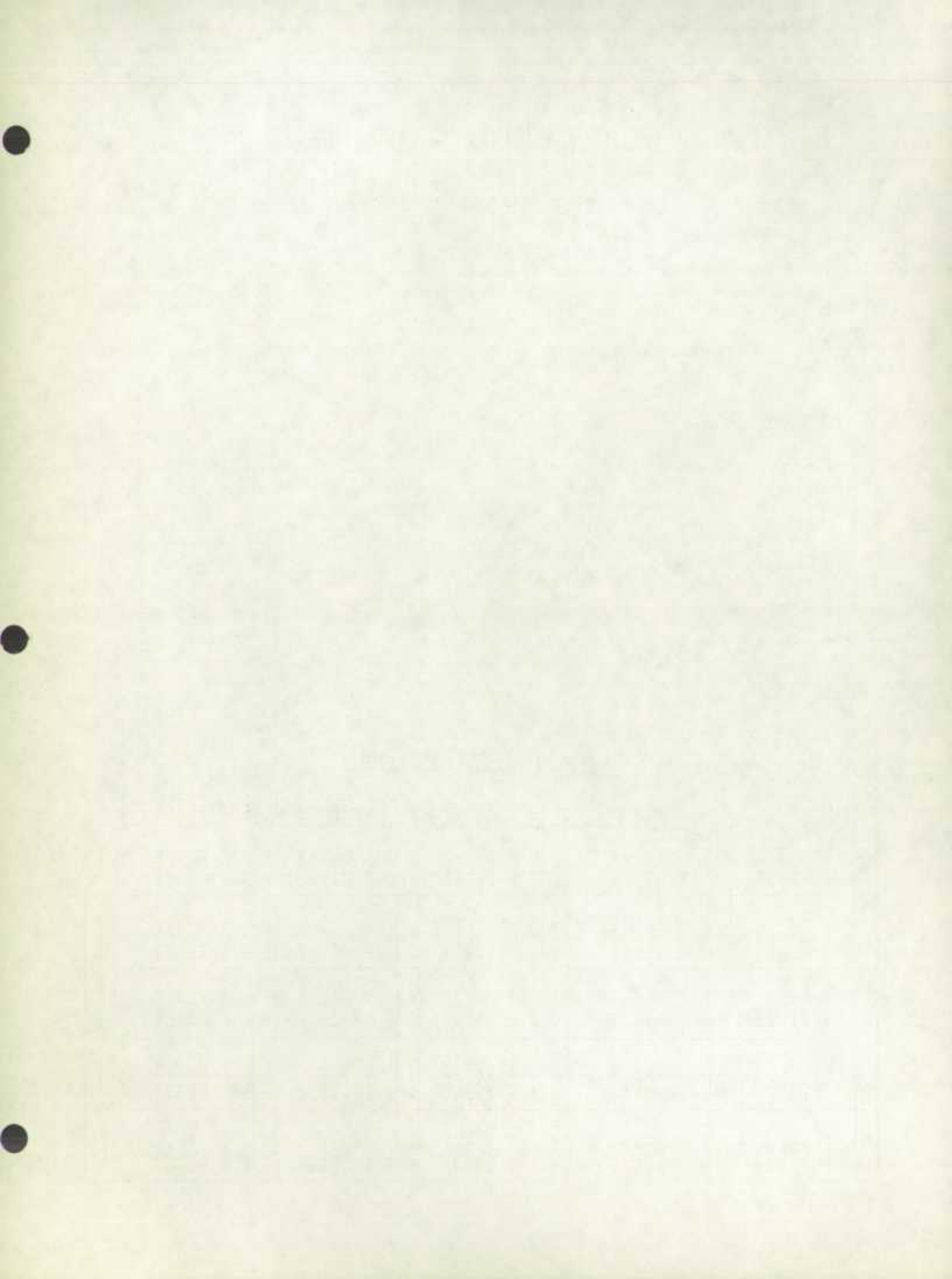

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

September, 1958

Presented in this report are freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada. The British Columbia Electric Railway, which reported for the first time in January 1958, is not included in the comparable 1957 data. As of January 1, 1958 the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National System.

During the month of September, revenue freight loaded in Canada or received from United States rail connections totalled 14,081,922 tons or 12.1 per cent less than the 16,019,389 tons handled in the same month of 1957. Of the September 1958 total, 12,135,102 tons (13,688,490 in 1957) were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports), 892,266 tons (1,143,561) were received from United States rail destined to points in Canada and 1,054,554 tons (1,187,338) were intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada).

Products of mines loaded in Canada during September amounted to 6,139,514 tons, down from 7,551,028 a year ago. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled during both periods accounting for 2,395,259 tons in 1958 and 3,344,953 tons in the previous year. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased in 1958 to 3,029,817 tons from 2,979,438 with gasoline and newsprint paper being the main commodity carried. Products of agriculture dropped in volume to 1,613,863 tons from 1,782,111 with wheat loadings contributing 838,496 tons in the current year in contrast to 965,349 tons previously. Products of forests rose slightly to 1,135,556 tons from 1,125,607 and animals and products fell to 98,919 tons from 106,928. Less than carload freight (L.C.L.) declined to 117,433 tons from 143,378.

A principal breakdown of freight loaded in Canada shows declines in eight of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia loadings declined 23.5 per cent to 727,914 tons from 950,926 in 1957, while Quebec with the second largest decline fell 21.0 per cent to 3,824,412 tons from 4,842,186. Loadings in Newfoundland rose 12.1 per cent to 159,402 tons from 142,190 and in British Columbia 5.6 per cent to 947,571 tons in contrast to 897,650.

During the month of September, 14,184,821 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 11,902,231 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,282,590 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 16,120,108 tons terminated in September 1957 of which 13,617,793 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,502,315 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first nine months of 1958 a total of 113,656,247 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This compares with 129,321,905 tons in the previous year.
