RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

January, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of the following twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually):

During the month of January 10,975,292 tons of revenue freight were handled by railways in Canada, a decline of 1.9 per cent from 11,182,793 tons a year earlier. Of the January 1959 total, 8,912,838 tons (8,966,751 in 1958) were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports); 905,465 tons (934,022) were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada; and 1,156,989 tons (1,282,020) were intransit movements, or United States to United States through Canada.

Products of mines loaded during January amounted to 2,998,464 tons, down from 3,016,985 a year ago. Bituminous coal was the principal commodity handled during both periods, accounting for 1,105,971 tons in January 1959 and 1,183,617 tons in the previous year. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements decreased to 2,734,301 tons from 2,808,190 with fuel, road and petroleum residual oils, n.o.s., and newsprint paper being the main commodities carried. Products of agriculture rose to 2,030,037 tons from 1,835,419 with wheat loadings contributing 53.4 per cent or 1,083,530 tons during the current period in contrast to 59.2 per cent or 1,085,891 tons previously. Products of forests fell to 989,837 tons from 1,101,565 and animals and products fell to 81,054 tons from 110,054. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 16.3 per cent to 79,145 tons from 94,538.

During the month under review a total of 11,043,961 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 8,663,660 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,380,301 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,220,703 tons terminated in January 1958, of which 8,622,850 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,597,853 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.
