RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

October, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (The C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenue of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of October, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 16,675,621 tons, an increase of 10.4 per cent from 15,107,165 tons in October 1958. Of the 1959 total, 14,648,025 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 13,007,072 tons in the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 959,223 tons as compared with 964,744 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,068,373 tons as opposed to 1,135,349 in 1958.

During the month under review, products of mines loaded in Canada totalled 7,944,564 tons, up 33.1 per cent from 5,967,800 tons a year earlier. Iron ore was the principal commodity moved in both years accounting for 3,853,721 tons in 1959 and 2,197,585 tons in 1958. Tonnages handled in the four remaining commodity groups declined from the previous year with animals and products down 19.2 per cent to 104,436 tons from 129,301; products of forests down 7.0 per cent to 1,089,542 tons from 1,171,435; agricultural products, down 6.6 per cent to 2,259,572 tons from 2,420,076; and manufactures and miscellaneous down 1.8 per cent to 3,148,092 tons from 3,206,269 in 1958. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 101,819 tons from 112,191.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded on lines in Canada shows increases in five of the ten provinces. Loadings rose 34.9 per cent in Quebec; 19.2 per cent in Ontario; 15.6 per cent in Nova Scotia; 13.6 per cent in Newfoundland; and 6.4 per cent in New Brunswick. Manitoba reported the largest decline, dropping 14.1 per cent.

During the month of October, 16,716,276 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 14,318,095 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,398,181 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 15,194,973 tons terminated in October 1958 of which 12,621,521 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,573,452 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first ten months of 1959 a total of 138,412,031 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections in contrast to 128,763,412 tons in the corresponding ten months of 1958.
