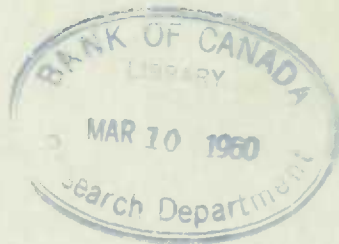

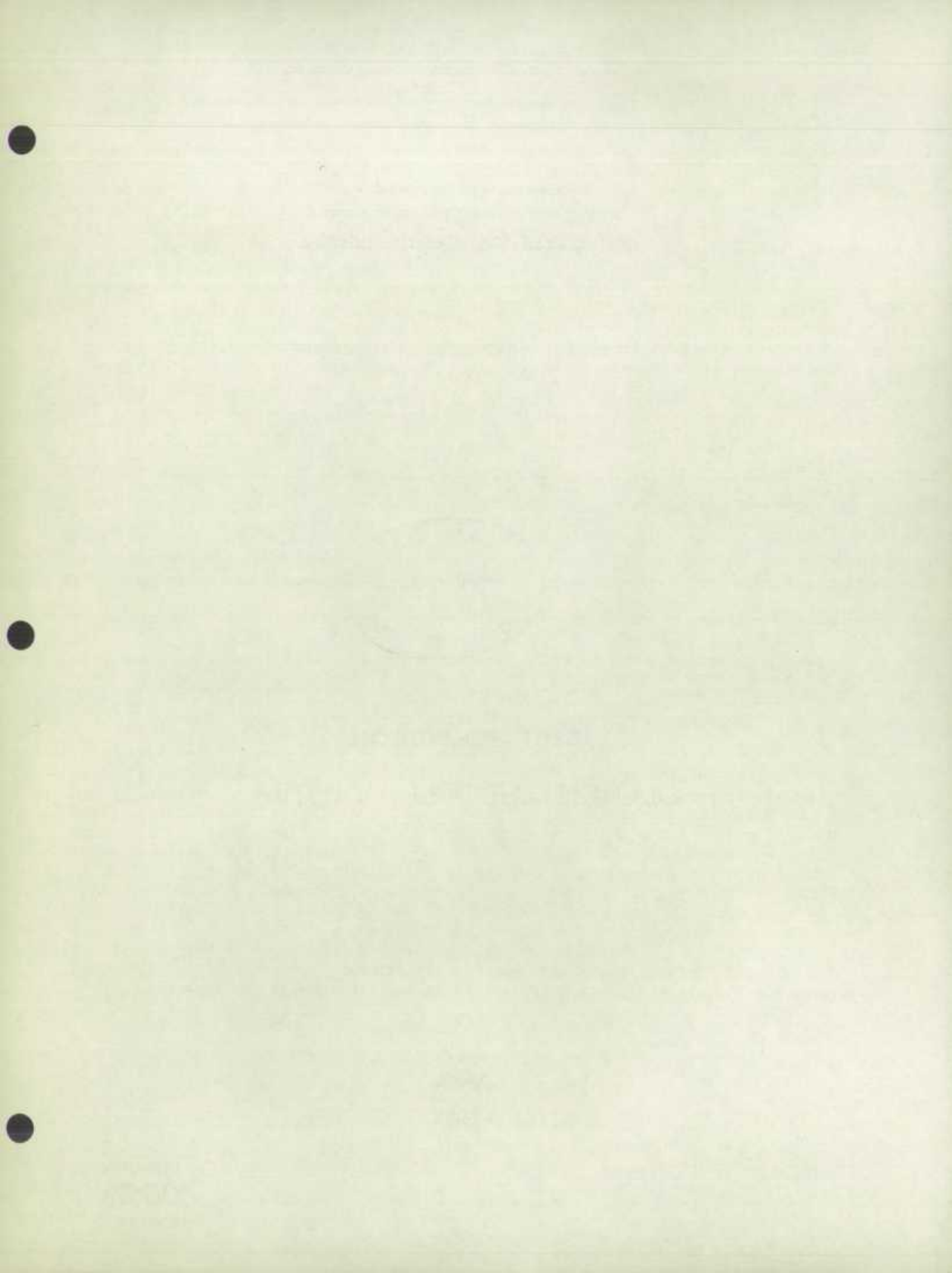

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

November, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (The C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of November, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 14,262,126 tons, an increase of 17.8 per cent from 12,110,870 tons in November 1958. During the month under review, 12,195,495 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 10,218,229 tons in the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 933,547 tons as compared with 818,956 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,132,084 tons as opposed to 1,073,685 in November 1958.

In the commodity groups, products of mines loaded in Canada totalled 5,640,647 tons, up 47.1 per cent from 3,834,542 tons a year earlier. Iron ore movements were mainly responsible for the increase, rising to 2,009,583 tons from 661,205. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements rose to 3,157,707 tons in 1959 from 2,856,426 with fuel, road, and petroleum residual oils, n.o.s. increasing to 327,291 tons from 290,621. Products of forests carried increased to 1,006,786 tons from 934,697, while products of agriculture declined to 2,192,461 tons from 2,373,612. Animals and products declined in volume to 109,556 tons from 114,982 in 1958.

A provincial breakdown of revenue freight loaded in Canada showed increases in six of the ten provinces. The greatest of these occurred in Quebec where loadings rose 69.2 per cent to 3,502,016 tons from 2,069,355. Nova Scotia with the second largest increase rose 29.1 per cent to 987,305 tons from 764,881. Saskatchewan and Alberta loadings were down 13.3 per cent and 9.4 per cent, respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 14,370,100 tons. Of this total 11,902,793 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,467,307 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,123,291 tons terminated in November 1958 of which 9,875,977 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,247,314 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first eleven months of 1959 a total of 152,674,157 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections in contrast to 140,874,282 tons in the previous year.
