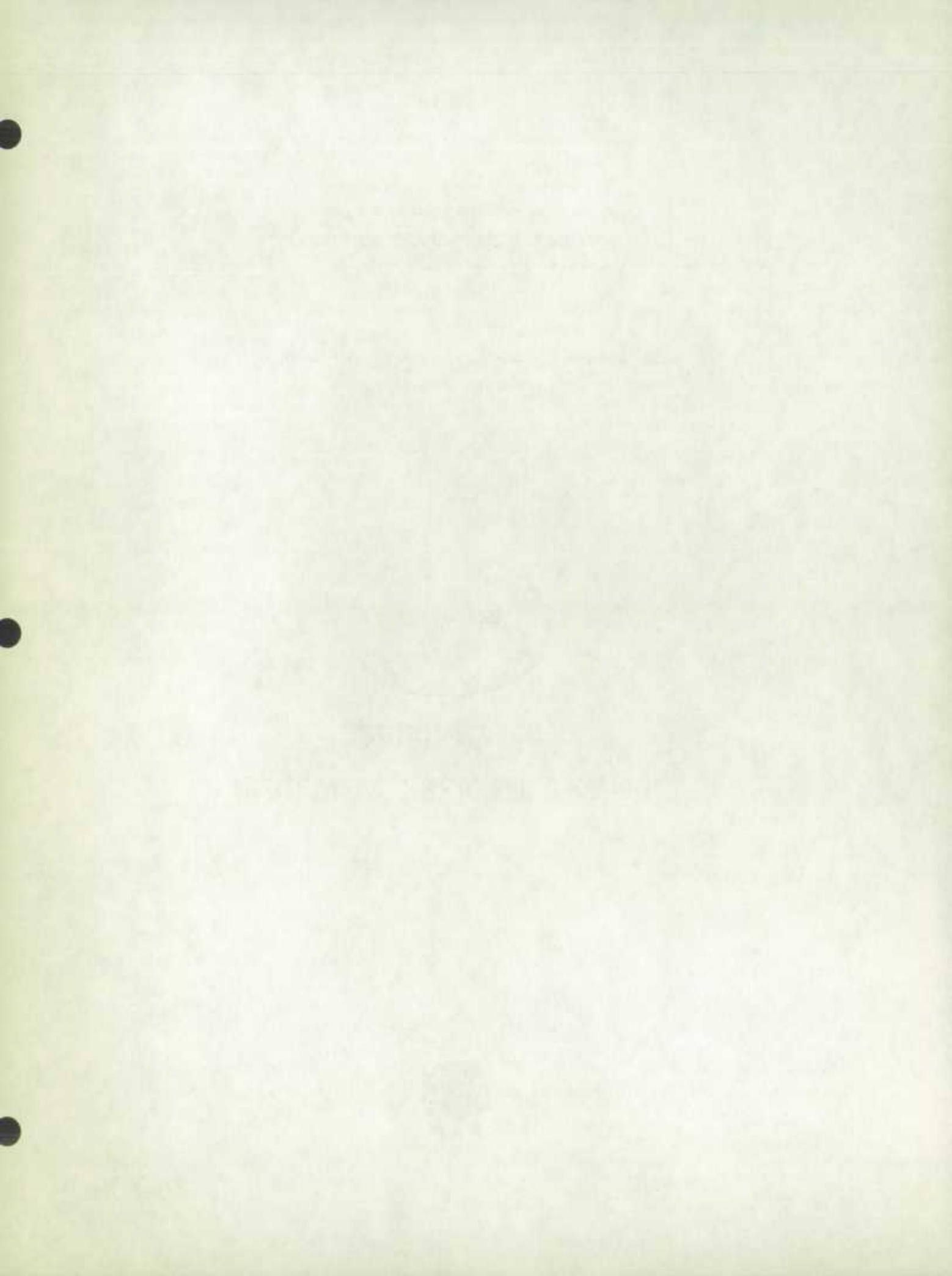

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

February, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of February, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada or received from United States rail connections totalled 10,628,405 tons an increase of 5.4 per cent from 10,085,244 tons for the same month in 1958. Of the February, 1959 total 8,492,341 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 8,115,291 tons loaded in 1958. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 921,021 tons as compared with 860,252, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,215,043 tons as against 1,109,701 in 1958.

In the month under review, products of mines loaded in Canada totalled 2,831,550 tons up 7.5 per cent from 2,634,565 tons a year earlier. Bituminous coal was the principal commodity handled during both periods accounting for 923,515 tons in 1959 and 1,033,218 tons in 1958. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased in 1959 to 2,754,884 tons from 2,582,041, with fuel, road and petroleum residual oils, n.o.s. and newsprint paper being the main commodities carried. Products of agriculture loaded in Canada rose to 1,634,645 tons from 1,523,015 with loadings of wheat aggregating 830,485 tons in the current year and 792,823 tons a year ago. Products of forests declined to 1,113,715 tons from 1,194,744, as did animals and products dropping to 71,436 tons from 86,671. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 86,111 tons from 94,255 in 1958.

Though total freight loaded in Canada increased in February 1959, a provincial breakdown shows declines in seven of the ten provinces. The greatest of these occurred in Manitoba and Newfoundland dropping 9.5 per cent and 7.8 per cent respectively. British Columbia registered the largest increase in loadings, rising 20.7 per cent, while Quebec rose 16.4 per cent, and Alberta 15.8 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on lines in Canada during the month totalled 10,584,538 tons of which 8,214,323 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,370,215 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 10,113,644 tons terminated in February, 1958 of which 7,757,510 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,356,134 tons were delivered to United States.
