## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

March, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of March, 11,339,037 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada or received from United States rail connections. This represents an increase of 4.1 per cent from 10,888,180 tons for the same month of 1958. Of the March 1959 total, 8,978,295 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as compared with 8,660,907 tons in March 1958. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 1,019,624 tons as against 952,408, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,341,118 tons in contrast to 1,274,865 a year earlier.

A breakdown of freight, by the six commodity groups, shows the following tonnages loaded at points in Canada: products of agriculture, 1,580,898 tons (as against 1,596,989 in 1958); animals and products, 78,249 tons (96,865); products of mines, 2,962,186 tons (2,733,940); products of forests, 1,141,192 tons (1,160,747); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,122,071 tons (2,963,298). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped to 93,699 tons from 109,068.

A provincial breakdown of the total freight loaded in Canada shows increases ranging downward from 15.0 per cent to 1.5 per cent in Alberta, British Columbia, Quebec, Nova Scotia, Ontario and New Brunswick. Loadings in Prince Edward Island fell 19.9 per cent, while those in Newfoundland, Saskatchewan and Manitoba declined 12.8 per cent, 10.3 per cent and 0.6 per cent, respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month totalled 11,319,870 tons, of which 8,580,282 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers), and 2,739,588 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 10,965,302 tons terminated in March 1958 comprising 8,233,044 tons unloaded in Canada and 2,732,258 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first quarter of 1959, a total of 32,942,734 tons of freight were loaded in Canada or received from the United States as compared with 32,156,217 tons in the corresponding quarter of 1958.
