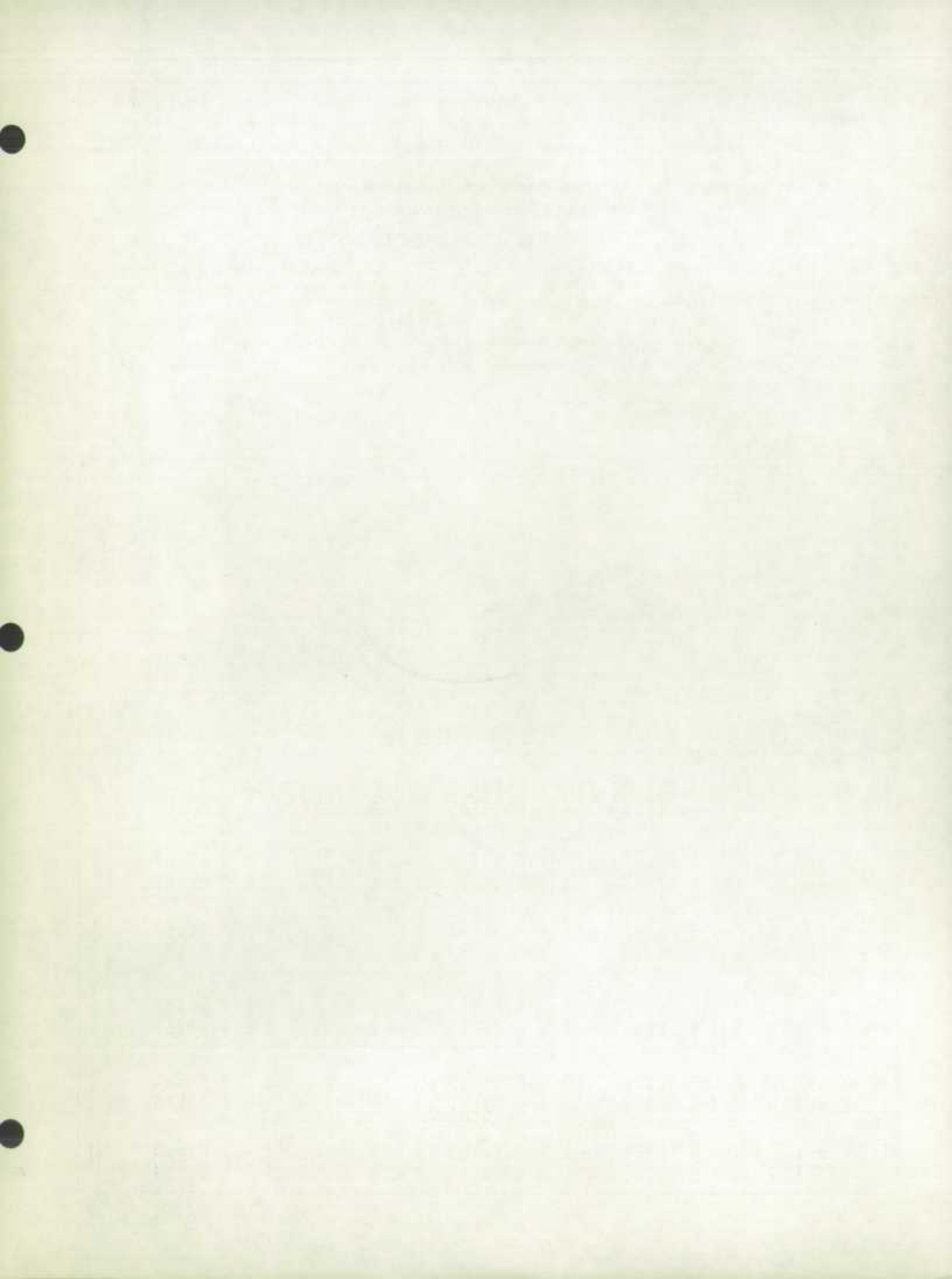

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

April, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the Canadian National Railways, Canadian Pacific Railway Company and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually).

During the month of April 11,896,705 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada or received from United States rail connections, up 7.3 per cent from 11,086,938 in the corresponding 1958 period. Of the current month total, 9,645,928 (9,013,386 in 1958) were domestic loadings, including water imports, and 949,498 tons (916,776) were receipts from United States connections destined to Canadian points. Intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,301,279 tons in contrast to 1,156,776 a year earlier.

A breakdown, by commodity groups, of the 9,645,928 tons of railway freight loaded in Canada during April, 1959 shows that 1,622,352 or 16.8 per cent were products of agriculture (1,751,310 or 19.4 per cent of 9,013,386 in 1958); 86,090 tons or 0.9 per cent were animals and products (90,373 or 1.0 per cent); 3,638,645 tons or 37.7 per cent were products of mines (3,196,491 or 35.5 per cent); 909,386 tons or 9.4 per cent were forest products (749,153 or 8.3 per cent); 3,250,502 tons or 33.7 per cent were manufactures and miscellaneous (3,102,892 or 34.4 per cent); and 138,953 tons or 1.5 per cent was less than carload freight (123,167 or 1.4 per cent).

On a provincial basis loadings increased in all but three provinces during the period under review. In Nova Scotia 43.5 per cent more tonnage was handled, while in New Brunswick, British Columbia, and Alberta the volume rose 24.6, 20.5 and 16.8 per cent respectively. The greatest decline occurred in Saskatchewan where loadings fell 8.1 per cent. Quebec registered a 1.8 per cent drop in traffic and Manitoba was only 0.8 per cent off that of a year ago.

During the month, 11,921,873 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada, 9,197,653 tons of which were unloaded at points in the Dominion (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,724,220 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 11,175,827 tons terminated in April 1958, comprising 8,841,005 tons at Canadian points and 2,334,822 to United States connections.
