RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

June, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of June, 15,407,797 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This represents an increase of 4.5 per cent from 14,744,831 tons in the same month of 1958. Of the June 1959 total, 13,366,434 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in comparison with 12,864,483 tons in June 1958, and freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 879,620 tons as against 841,247. Intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,161,743 tons in contrast to 1,039,101 a year earlier.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during June totalled 6,637,687 tons, up 17.7 per cent from 5,638,930 tons a year earlier. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled in both years accounting for 2,723,446 tons in 1959 and 2,004,699 tons in 1958. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased in 1959 to 3,147,500 from 2,919,442 with gasoline and newsprint paper being the main commodities carried. Products of agriculture dropped in volume to 2,064,404 tons from 2,895,629 with wheat loadings contributing only 1,393,515 tons in the current year in contrast to 1,891,176 tons, previously. Products of forests rose slightly to 1,332,568 tons from 1,219,746, while animals and products fell to 79,867 tons from 84,145. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 104,408 tons from 106,591.

During the month of June, 15,568,318 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total 13,128,503 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,439,815 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 14,790,733 tons terminated in June 1958 of which 12,638,847 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,151,886 tons delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first six months of 1959 a total of 73,923,878 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections as compared with 71,433,710 tons in the corresponding six months of 1958.
