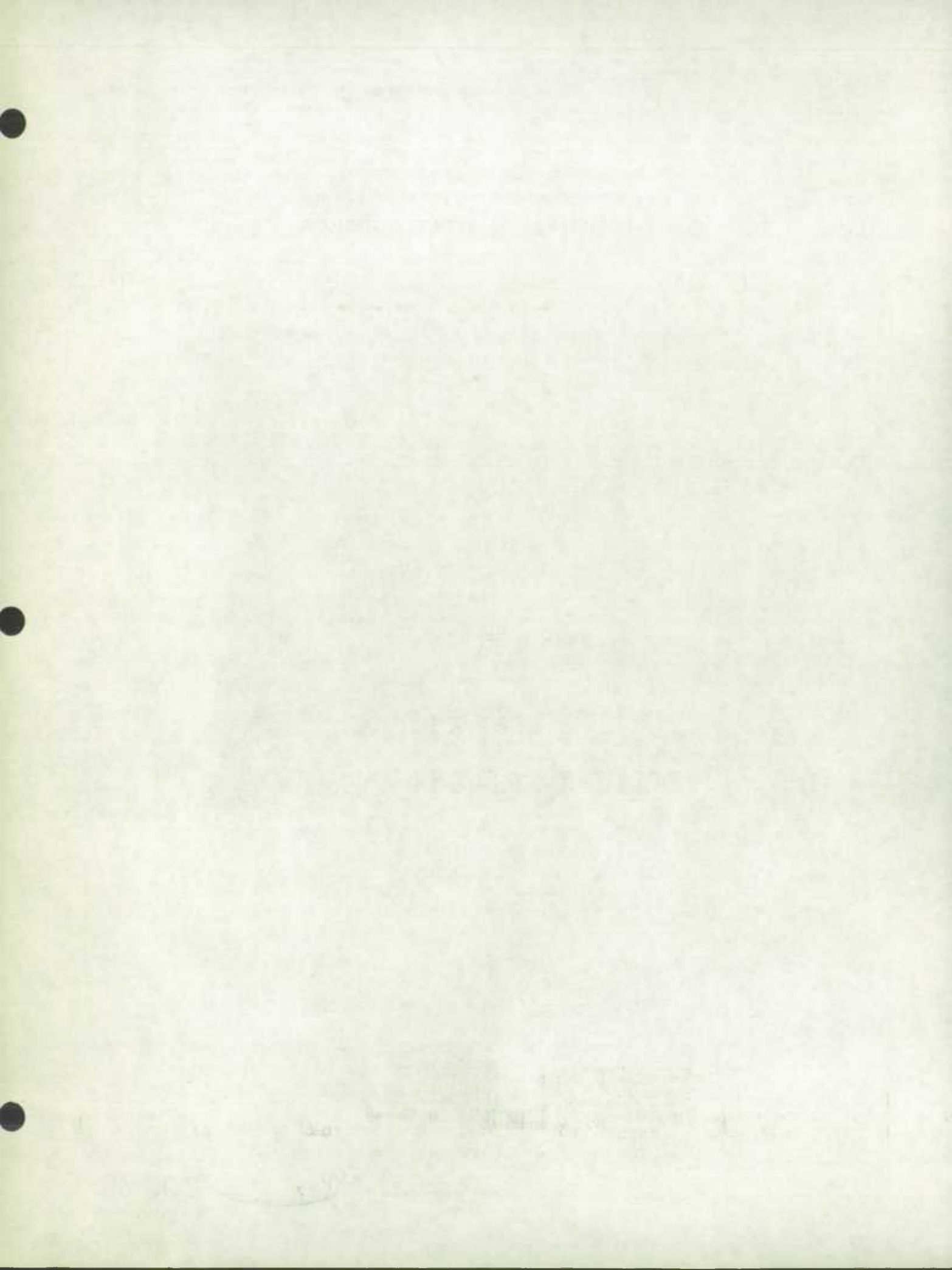

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

July, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of July, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 16,187,976 tons an increase of 10.3 per cent from 14,679,308 tons in July 1958. Of the July 1959 total 14,136,647 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 12,837,151 tons in the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 862,793 tons as compared with 838,495 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,188,536 tons as opposed to 1,003,662 in 1958.

In the month under review, products of mines loaded in Canada totalled 7,376,100 tons, up 19.7 per cent from 6,163,424 tons a year earlier. Iron ore and crude gypsum were the main commodities responsible for the increase, with iron ore movements increasing by 792,961 tons to 3,103,089 and crude gypsum 382,408 tons to 536,785. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased in 1959 to 3,161,971 tons from 2,913,386. Products of forests increased slightly to 1,265,976 tons from 1,238,380, while products of agriculture declined to 2,125,968 tons from 2,318,906, and animals and products dropped to 80,824 tons from 88,661. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) rose to 125,808 tons from 114,394 in 1958.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month amounted to 16,232,443 tons, of which 13,748,954 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water-carriers) and 2,483,489 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 14,764,718 tons terminated in July 1958, comprising 12,613,019 tons unloaded in Canada and 2,151,699 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first seven months of 1959, a total of 90,111,816 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as compared with 86,113,018 tons in the corresponding period of 1958.
