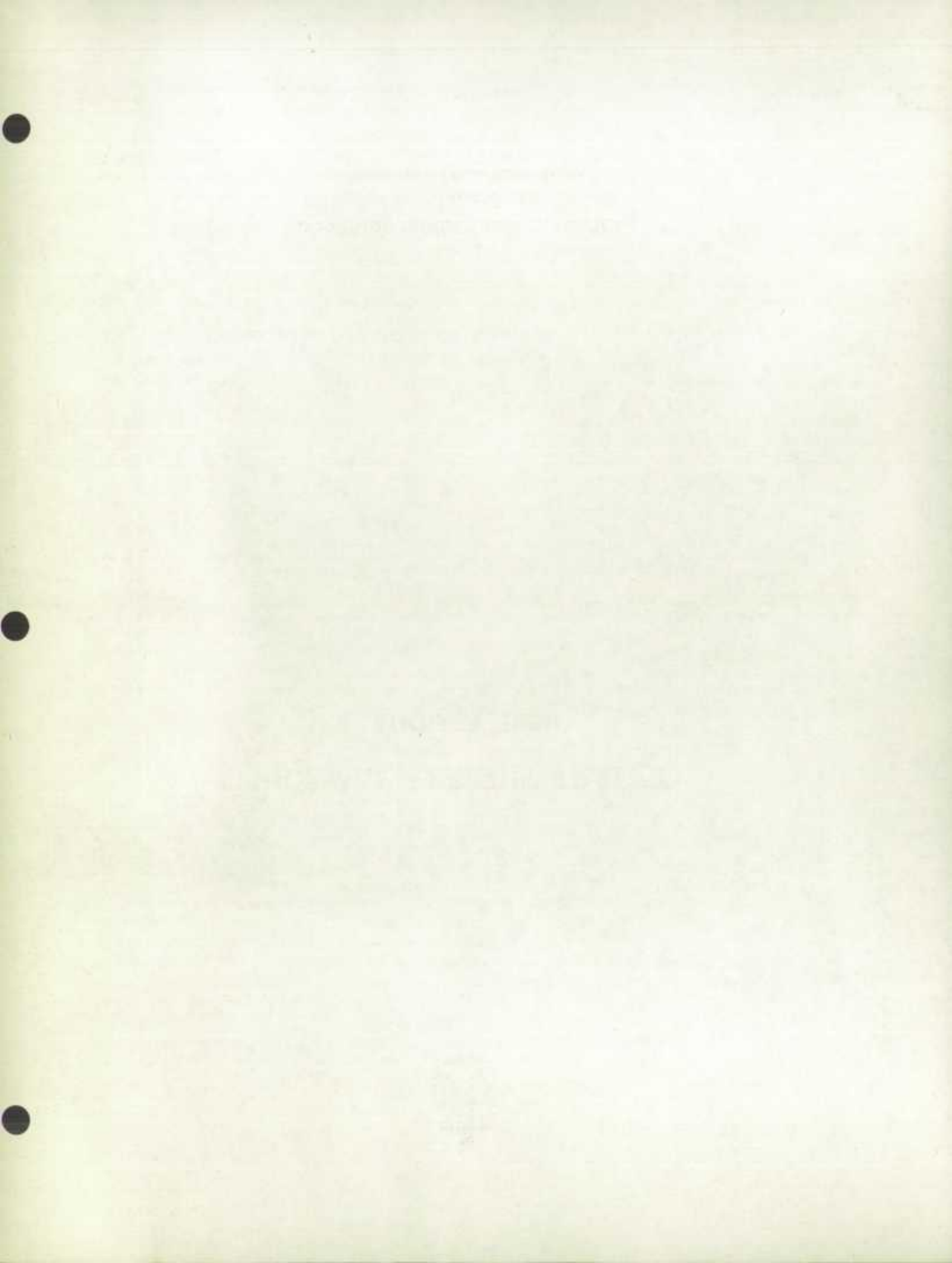

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

August, 1959

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of August, 15,329,973 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 13.9 per cent from 13,461,307 tons in the same period one year earlier. Of the August 1959 total, 13,477,849 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in comparison with 11,634,685 tons in August 1958. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 774,591 tons as against 781,466. Intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,077,533 tons in contrast to 1,045,156 a year earlier.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during August totalled 7,217,767 tons, up 25.5 per cent from 5,752,578 tons a year earlier. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled in both years accounting for 3,327,107 tons in 1959 and 2,388,187 tons in 1958. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased in 1959 to 2,984,331 tons from 2,829,421 with gasoline and newsprint paper being the main commodities carried. Products of agriculture rose to 2,028,771 tons from 1,687,085 with wheat loadings totalling 1,340,195 tons in the current year in contrast to 1,083,485 in 1958. Products of forests declined slightly to 1,057,928 tons from 1,166,708, while animals and products dropped to 81,481 tons from 87,634. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) fell to 107,571 tons from 111,259.

During the month of August, 15,290,976 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total 13,046,458 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,244,518 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 13,552,327 tons terminated in August 1958 of which 11,344,409 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,207,918 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first eight months of 1959, 105,441,789 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.9 per cent from 99,574,325 tons in the corresponding eight months of 1958.
