

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

September, 1959

Presented in this report are freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the Canadian National Railways, Canadian Pacific Railway Company and other carriers having average gross revenue of \$500,000 or more annually).

During the month of September, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 16,294,621 tons, up 15.7 per cent from 14,081,922 tons in the corresponding 1958 period. Of the September 1959 total, 14,322,525 tons (12,135,102 in 1958) were loaded in Canada, including imports at lake or ocean ports; 928,006 tons (892,266) were received from United States rail destined to points in Canada; and 1,044,090 tons (1,054,554) were in-transit movements (United States to United States through Canada).

Products of mines, which consistently provides the largest share of railway tonnage, accounted for loadings totalling 7,838,777 tons, up 27.7 per cent from 6,139,514 in September 1958. Iron ore was the principal commodity handled during both periods with 3,725,349 tons in 1959 and 2,395,259 tons in the previous year. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased 6.5 per cent to 3,227,557 tons in 1959 from 3,029,817 with gasoline, manufactures and miscellaneous, and, newsprint paper being the main commodities carried. Products of agriculture increased in volume to 2,015,651 tons from 1,613,863 with wheat loadings contributing 1,072,924 tons or 53.2 per cent of the total in the current year in contrast to 838,496 tons or 52.0 per cent in 1958. Products of forests decreased in volume to 1,035,976 tons from 1,135,556 as did animal products which were down to 89,007 tons from 98,919. Loadings of less than carload freight (L.C.L.) declined slightly to 115,557 tons from 117,433.

A provincial breakdown of freight loaded at points in Canada shows an increase in volume carried in eight of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia loadings rose 45.7 per cent to 1,060,620 tons from 727,914 while Quebec with the second largest increase rose 30.1 per cent to 4,973,913 tons from 3,824,412. In both instances commodities in the mine products group were chiefly responsible for the increases with crude gypsum the main item in Nova Scotia and iron ore the main item in Quebec.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 16,322,545 tons. Of this total 14,034,178 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,288,367 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 14,184,821 tons terminated in September 1958 of which 11,902,231 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,282,590 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first nine months of 1959 a total of 121,736,410 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, as compared with 113,656,247 tons in the previous year.
