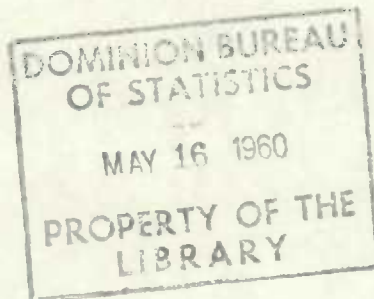

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

January, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of the following twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada:

During the month of January 10,481,264 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada or received from United States rail connections, a decline of 4.5 per cent from 10,975,292 tons in the corresponding 1959 period. Of the January 1960 total, 8,454,231 tons (8,912,838 in 1959) were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports); 765,312 tons (905,465) were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada; and 1,261,721 tons (1,156,989) were intransit movements, or United States to United States through Canada.

Products of mines loaded during January amounted to 2,933,528 tons, down from 2,998,464 a year earlier. Bituminous coal was the principal commodity handled during both periods, accounting for 984,923 tons in January 1960 and 1,105,971 tons in the previous year. Products of agriculture decreased to 1,391,459 tons from 2,030,037 with wheat loadings contributing 54.3 per cent or 754,967 tons in the current period in contrast to 53.4 per cent or 1,083,530 tons previously. Animals and products fell to 75,354 tons from 81,054, while manufactures and miscellaneous movements increased to 2,832,700 tons from 2,734,301. Fuel and petroleum residual oils, n.o.s., and newsprint paper were the main commodities carried in the latter group. Products of forests rose to 1,141,461 tons from 989,837 previously and less than carload freight (l.c.l.) increased to 79,729 tons from 79,145.

During the month under review a total of 10,459,224 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 7,900,349 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,558,875 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,043,961 tons terminated in January 1959, of which 8,663,660 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,380,301 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.
