RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

October, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During October, 14,636,126 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 12.2 per cent from 16,675,621 tons reported a year earlier. Of the October 1960 total, 12,657,553 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 14,648,025 tons reported for the same month last year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada decreased to 855,262 tons from 959,223 while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,123,311 tons from 1,068,373 in October 1959.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review, amounted to 6,046,052 tons, down 23.9 per cent from 7,944,564 tons the previous year. Animals and products declined 14.3 per cent to 89,489 tons from 104,436; manufactures and miscellaneous decreased 4.2 per cent to 3,015,530 tons from 3,148,092; and products of forests dropped 1.1 per cent to 1,077,098 tons from 1,089,542. Products of agriculture rose 3.5 per cent to 2,338,667 tons from 2,259,572 while less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 10.9 per cent to 90,717 tons from 101,819.

On a provincial basis, loadings decreased in all provinces except Prince Edward Island, Alberta and British Columbia. Nova Scotia reported 24.6 less tonnage; Quebec 22.7 per cent; Ontario 17.8 per cent; Saskatchewan 10.4 per cent; Newfoundland 8.5 per cent; New Brunswick 4.6 per cent and Manitoba 1.3 per cent. Prince Edward Island, Alberta and British Columbia reported increases of 19.8 per cent; 19.7 per cent; and 1.8 per cent, respectively.

In October 1960, 14,854,185 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada, a decline of 11.1 per cent from 16,716,276 tons reported for October 1959. Of the 1960 total, 12,505,490 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,348,695 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 14,318,095 tons terminated a year earlier, 2,398,181 tons of which were delivered to rail connections in the United States.
