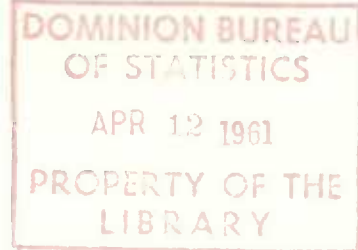

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

November, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During November, 12,814,560 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 10.1 per cent from 14,261,126 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the November 1960 total, 9,798,709 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 12,195,495 tons a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 841,046 tons versus 933,547 for November 1959, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 2,174,805 tons as against 1,132,084 a year earlier.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 3,776,008 tons, down 33.1 per cent from 5,640,647 tons reported in November 1959. Animals and products decreased 11.8 per cent to 96,593 tons from 109,556; products of agriculture declined 11.6 per cent to 1,937,751 tons from 2,192,461; manufactures and miscellaneous fell 8.0 per cent to 2,905,838 tons from 3,157,707 and products of forests decreased 1.7 per cent to 989,186 tons from 1,006,786. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) showed an increase of 5.7 per cent with 93,333 tons loaded in the month under review compared with 88,338 a year earlier.

On a provincial basis, decreases occurred in seven of the ten provinces during November 1960. Quebec reported 47.4 per cent less tonnage; Nova Scotia 21.9 per cent; Manitoba 15.4 per cent; Ontario 10.1 per cent; New Brunswick 7.2 per cent; British Columbia 5.8 per cent and Saskatchewan 3.5 per cent. Increases were reported by Prince Edward Island (8.9 per cent); Newfoundland (4.8 per cent) and Alberta (4.1 per cent).

During November 1960, a total of 12,019,214 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this amount, 9,763,163 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,256,051 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 14,370,100 tons terminated in November 1959 of which 11,902,793 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,467,307 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.
