RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

December, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R., and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During December, 10,753,866 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 11.4 per cent from 12,136,430 tons reported for the same month of 1959. Of the December 1960 total, 8,931,032 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 9,992,871 a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 623,803 tons as against 857,711 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,199,031 tons versus 1,285,848 in December 1959.

Animals and products loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review totalled 77,195 tons, down 14.8 per cent from 90,626 tons the previous year. Products of mines decreased to 3,040,958 tons from 3,464,124; products of agriculture declined to 1,796,837 tons from 2,041,098; manufactures and miscellaneous fell to 2,798,929 tons from 3,165,372 and products of forests decreased slightly to 1,100,439 tons from 1,152,929. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) increased in volume to 116,674 tons from 78,722.

A provincial breakdown of revenue freight loaded in Canada showed decreases in seven of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia reported 31.1 per cent less tonnage; Ontario 20.0 per cent; British Columbia 8.7 per cent; Manitoba and Prince Edward Island 7.1 per cent; New Brunswick 6.1 per cent and Quebec 5.3 per cent. Increases were registered in Newfoundland (22.2 per cent); Saskatchewan (8.2 per cent) and Alberta (6.2 per cent).

During December 1960, revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 10,906,541 tons. Of this total, 8,384,670 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,521,871 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,161,612 tons terminated in December 1959, of which 9,200,814 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,960,798 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the year 1960, freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 158,429,582 tons, down 3.9 per cent from 164,809,587 tons reported in 1959.

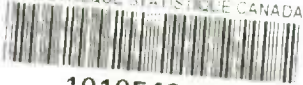
