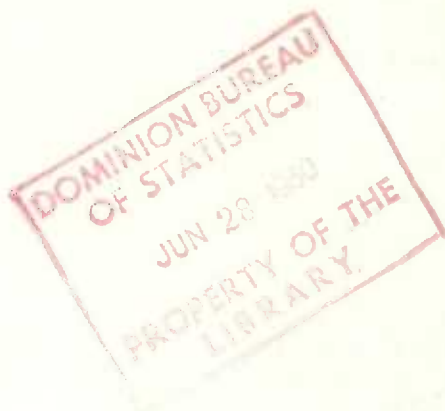

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

February, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of February, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 11,530,395 tons, an increase of 8.5 per cent from 10,628,405 tons for the same month in 1959. Of the February 1960 total, 9,307,161 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 8,492,341 tons loaded in 1959. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 845,573 tons as compared with 921,021, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,377,661 tons as against 1,215,043.

A breakdown of freight, by the six commodity groups, shows the following tonnages loaded at points in Canada: products of agriculture, 1,690,041 tons (as against 1,634,645 in 1959); animals and products, 76,479 tons (71,436); products of mines, 2,996,995 tons (2,831,550); products of forests, 1,431,047 tons (1,113,715); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 3,030,647 tons (2,754,884). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped to 81,952 tons from 86,111 in 1959.

A geographical analysis of the total freight loaded in Canada shows an increased volume handled in eight of the ten provinces. The greatest of these occurred in Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and British Columbia where traffic was up 74.8 per cent, 28.4 per cent, 26.0 per cent and 19.3 per cent respectively. Prince Edward Island registered the largest decline in loadings, dropping 11.6 per cent, while Alberta decreased 7.9 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on lines in Canada during the month totalled 11,555,105 tons, of which 8,714,470 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,840,635 were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 10,584,538 tons terminated in February 1959 of which 8,214,323 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,370,215 tons were delivered to United States.
